INTRODUCTION: THE KING NO ONE WAS EXPECTING

God often works in unexpected ways.

Matthew 1, Matthew proved that Jesus was legally in the line of David, and so heir to the throne.

Matthew 2, Matthew introduces the kind of King that Jesus came to be.

"Previously, when Saul was king over us, you [David] were the one who led Israel out and in. And the Lord said to you, 'You will shepherd My people Israel, and you will be a ruler over Israel.'"

Psalm 78:70-72

He also chose David His servant And took him from the sheepfolds; From the care of the ewes with suckling lambs He brought him To shepherd Jacob His people, And Israel His inheritance. So he shepherded them according to the integrity of his heart, And guided them with his skillful hands.

B. CHRIST CAME AS A SHEPHERD

Fzekiel 34:12-16

The word "shepherd" is used four times Matthew. Each time it is in reference to Jesus.

1. The Shepherd King Cares

Matthew 9:36

Seeing the people, He felt compassion for them, because they were distressed and dispirited like sheep without a shepherd.

2. The Shepherd King Discerns

Matthew 25:32, 33

All the nations will be gathered before Him; and He will separate them from one another, as the shepherd separates the sheep from the goats; and He will put the sheep on His right, and the goats on the left.

3. The Shepherd King Unites And Leads

Matthew 26:31

Then Jesus *said to them, "You will all fall away because of Me this night, for it is written, 'I will strike down the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered.'..."
