Natural Law

Right (dikaios): conforming to law or custom

Divine Law

Ephesians 6:2 "Honor your father and mother" (this is the first commandment with a promise),

Honor (timaō): honor, show respect, give recognition, often implying action to show that honor

Exodus 20:12 "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you.

Ephesians 6:3 "that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land."

Ephesians 6:4 Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Fathers (pater): parents both father and mother

Ephesians 6:4 Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord.

Provoke (paragizō): make angry; exasperate

Colossians 3:21 Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged.

Well-meaning overprotection is a common cause of resentment in children.

Children who are incessantly told they can do whatever they wish and can have their own way are children who will soon mock their parents, teachers, moral standards, the law, and society in general.

Discipline: (paideia): to provide instruction, with the intent of forming proper habits of behavior.

Instruction: (nouthesia): warning; admonition

Proverbs 19:18 Discipline your children, for in that there is hope; do not be a willing party to their death. (NIV)

Psalm 19:8 the precepts of the LORD are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the LORD is pure, enlightening the eyes;

Bondservant (doulos): slave

Ephesians 6:5-7 Bondservants, obey your earthly masters with fear and trembling, with a sincere heart, as you would Christ, <sup>6</sup>not by the way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but as bondservants of Christ, doing the will of God from the heart, <sup>7</sup>rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man,

Fear and trembling (phobou kai tromou)

This does not suggest servile respect — shaking in your boots lest you make a wrong move, or an obsequious, fawning "Yes, sir! Double yes, sir! Whatever you say,

sir!" Rather, it suggests Christian reverence and respect for the master's position and authority.

Sincere (haplotēs): generosity; liberality

A good will (eunoia): zeal; eagerness

Threatening (apeilē): declare harm to another

Partiality (prōsopolēmpsia): favoritism

Deuteronomy 10:17 For the LORD your God is God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God, who is not partial and takes no bribe.

Ephesians 6:10–12 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. <sup>11</sup>Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. <sup>12</sup>For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places.
