What God Seeks Deuteronomy 12:10-16

Worship is a matter of:

- I. Place —"a place which the Lord…shall choose" (vs. 10-12)

 A place that is:
- A. Inherited "the Lord your God gives you to inherit"
- **B.** Indwelt "cause His name to dwell there"
- C. Inspiring "you shall rejoice before the Lord...and your sons"
- II. Practice "there thou shall offer thy burnt offerings" (vs. 13-14) A practice of:
 - A. Discretion "Take heed to ... offer not thy burnt offerings"
 - **B.** Dedication "in the place which the Lord shall choose"
 - C. Demonstration "thou shall do all that I command you"
- III. Perspective "Which He has given thee" (vs. 15-16)

 A perspective that recognizes:
- A. Blessing "according to the blessing of the Lord"
- B. Bounty "as of the roebuck, and as of the hart"
- C. Blood -"ye shall not eat the blood"
