# Paradise Lost Deuteronomy 1:34-46

#### Sin leads to:

- **I. D**eath –"shall not one of these…see that good land" (vs. 34-36) *Losing sight of God's:*
- A. Person "The Lord heard the voice of your words"
- B. Promises "which I sware to give unto your fathers"
- C. Presence "because he wholly followed the Lord"
- II. Deprivation "Thou also shalt not go in thither" (vs. 37-40)

  Losing the benefits of:
  - A. Helpers "Joshua the son of Nun, which stands before thee"
  - **B.** Heritage "your little ones which ye said should be a prey"
  - C. Home "take your journey into the wilderness"
- III. Defeat "destroyed you in Seir" (vs. 41-46)

Losing our liberty through:

- A. Religion "we will go up and fight"
- **B.** Rebellion "ye would not hear, but rebelled"
- C. Regret "ye returned and wept before the Lord"
