I. The Messenger

- A. There are three Herod's mentioned in the Bible
 - 1. Herod the Great Matthew 2:1
 - 2. Herod Antipas Matthew 14:3
 - 3. Herod Agrippa Acts 12:1
- B. Herod the Great was a very jealous ruler.
 - 1. He came to power through brutality.
 - 2. His reign in Judea was fraught with distrust, betrayal, and murder.
- C. Herod made a wicked plan.
 - 1. Herod heard the message about the baby King.
 - 2. Herod checked out the wise men's story with the Bible.
 - 3. Herod returned to the wise men to find out more information.
 - 4. Herod then convinces the wise men to return to him with news of the baby.
- D. Herod was motivated by Satan.

II. The Message

- A. We get this from Matthew 2:3.
 - 1. Herod feared because of Herod's belief.
 - 2. Herod's belief did not do him any good.
- B. Herod was troubled because he would not accept Jesus' authority.
 - 1. Herod wanted to stay the ultimate authority.
 - 2. Herod was unwilling to accept Jesus.
- C. Satan and Herod were not the only ones worried about Jesus's arrival.

III. The Meaning

- A. Jesus is King.
- B. Every knee shall bow.
 - 1. Jesus is only dangerous to those who refuse to bow.
 - 2. The only ones who claimed He was dangerous were the ones who were unwilling to give up their authority.
 - 3. Every knee will bow to Jesus.
- C. Satan's authority has failed as well.
- D. Will you submit to the authority of the one who was born king?
