Freedom from Hypocrisy in Prayer:
“Lead Us Not Into Temptation”
Matthew 6:13

- The Christian life is war against temptation
 - It was war for *Paul*
 - It was war for *John*
 - It was war for *Peter*
- First, the *nature of* temptation
 - Two meanings of the word used for temptation:
 - *Positively*, it is a *test from God*
 - *Negatively*, it is a *temptation from Satan*
 - Two passages where God tests and Satan tempts:
 - An example from *James 1:2-12*
 - An example from *Genesis 50:15-20*
- Two important scriptural truths from James 1:13:

- God can never *be tempted by evil*
- God can never *tempt anyone to do evil*
- Two examples of God leading His people into temptation:
 - The temptation of *Jesus*
 - The temptation of *Job*
- Two questions the temptation of Job raises:
 - Why can't *God lead us into temptation to prove our faith?*
 - Why can't *Satan tempt us to see if our faith is real?*
- Two differences between Peter and Judas in their temptations:
 - Peter *had genuine faith*, Judas did not
 - Peter *was prayed for by Jesus*, Judas was not
- Second, the *petition concerning* temptation
 - Two possibilities concerning the meaning of the

petition, “Lead us not into temptation:

- The petition can be *hypothetical*
- The petition can be *real*

- Three reasons why God might lead us into temptation:
 - God might lead us into temptation to *strengthen our faith*
 - God might lead us into temptation to *prove our true sonship*
 - God might lead us into temptation to *show His glorious power*
