Leader: Christmas is getting closer! Why do we light the Advent

candles?

Family: Jesus said, "I am the Light of the world. He who follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the Light of Life."

Leader: What is the meaning of the fourth lighted candle?

Family: The fourth candle is the King Candle because Messiah came as the promised Son of King David to perfectly rule and defend His people.

Leader: Why was He born in Bethlehem?

Family: King David had been born in Bethlehem a thousand years before Jesus came to earth, and God promised that David's greater Son, Jesus, would also be born there. (Micah 5:2; Matthew 2:5-6)

Leader: What kind of King is Jesus?

Family: Jesus is the King of Kings and much greater than earthly rulers. His reign is holy, righteous, and just. His Kingdom will have no end. (1 Kings 2:45; Isaiah 9:7)

Leader: Matthew 2:1-6

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, ² saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." ³ When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; ⁴ and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵ They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

⁶ "And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

The King's Love Song

How Does Messiah Sing This Song of Praise?

This Is a Love Song about the Greatest Love in the Universe (1).

This Love Will Be Established in Heaven & Earth Forever (2).

Jesus Has Bound This Love by Sacred Oath Forever (3-4).

Re-read (sing) with This Christ-Centered Understanding.

Application—Delight in Christ with Joyful Obedience!

CONCLUSION: The Psalmist sings of the steadfast love of the Lord. This love song declares God the Father's intention to win a Bride for His Son and establish their union together forever. The song continues to describe the mechanics of this plan in terms of covenant (a sacred oath sealed in blood) and David's eternal throne. Jesus has come as the Father's chosen One, the true Son of David, who alone is qualified to establish David's eternal reign with His own blood on the cross. While Jesus is now with His Father temporarily, He has promised to return for His beloved Bride (those in Christ through faith) for that glorious wedding feast in the new heavens and new earth.

To Meditate on This Fourth Week—First Kings 10:6-10

⁶ And she said to the king, "The report was true that I heard in my own land of your words and of your wisdom, ⁷ but I did not believe the reports until I came and my own eyes had seen it. And behold, the half was not told me. Your wisdom and prosperity surpass the report that I heard. ⁸ Happy are your men! Happy are your servants, who continually stand before you and hear your wisdom! ⁹ Blessed be the Lord your God, who has delighted in you and set you on the throne of Israel! Because the Lord loved Israel forever, he has made you king, that you may execute justice and righteousness." ¹⁰ Then she gave the king 120 talents of gold, and a very great quantity of spices and precious stones. Never again came such an abundance of spices as these that the queen of Sheba gave to King Solomon.

Closing prayer for *fourth week* to be read in unison:
