## I. Introduction: What is a Family?

- A. What is the place of the church in cultural battles?
  - 1. The primary work of the church is to glorify God through worship and evangelism. Acts 1:8 2:42 I Co. 2:2
  - 2. Christians are called to be good citizens -which includes being a blessing to our community and nation. Rom. 13:1ff I Pet. 2:13ff Jer 29:7 Pr. 11:14
  - 3. While the church and state are separate institutions, our government leaders are accountable to God. Rom. 13:1ff Pr. 20:26 I Pe. 2:13ff
  - 4. We have the right and duty to proclaim principles from the Word of God as they apply to moral issues within our culture. Luke 3:19 Eph. 5:11 I Co. 13:6
  - 5. Believers may differ concerning strategy, approach, gifts and callings.
- B. The movement of Western culture to redefine marriage to include same sex couples is dramatic, significant and historic (in a bad sense).
  - 1. Shouldn't we just live and let live?
  - 2. The 'gay' agenda is not tolerant of biblical Christians.
  - 3. For many, whatever is legal must be moral (i.e. abortion).

## II. God established and defined marriage and the family at creation. Gen. 2:18-25 1:27

- A. Gender is determined and defined by God Who created us male and female. <u>Gen. 1:27</u> <u>Deut. 22:5</u> 23:1 Your gender is not a personal decision.
- B. God set the pattern for marriage from the beginning. Gen. 2:18-23 Mt. 19:4f
  - 1. For most, it is not good to be alone. Gen. 2:18
  - 2. God made a woman to complete the man (and the man to complete the woman).
  - 3. God establishes the roles for women and men in marriage.
  - 4. Those united in marriage are jointed by God in a lifelong covenant of companionship. Mt. 19:6
- C. God gave directives for marriage. Gen. 2:24
  - 1. Leave -- marriage creates a new independent family unit.
  - 2. Cleave -- marriage is permanent and intimate. Mt. 19:6 Mal. 2:16
  - 3. One flesh sexual union is to take place exclusively within the marriage covenant.
    - a. Sexual union is a unique symbolic expression of the oneness of marriage.
    - b. Children are the blessed fruit of their parents' love. Gen. 1:28 Ps. 127
    - c. Sexual union is intended to be delightful. Pr. 5:15f Song of Solomon
  - 4. Any sexual expression outside of marriage is a sinful violation of God's design adultery, fornication, lust, homosexuality, etc. Ex. 20: 14 Lev. 20:15 18:22
  - 5. Because of the fall, sin has entered into the world corrupting everything, including marriage and sexuality. Gen. 3:16 Ecc. 7:29

### III. How did our culture stray so far away from God's design?

- A. We are witnessing the culmination of a generation-long downward slide (devolution) of our hedonistic culture. II Ti. 3:4
  - 1. Easy no-fault divorce degrades the marriage covenant. Mt. 19:6 Mal. 2:16
  - 2. The sexual revolution resulting in the widespread acceptance of fornication and cohabitation further damages marriage. Heb. 13:4 I Cor. 6:9
  - 3. Obscenity has gone mainstream. Mt. 5:28

- 4. Abortion on demand is a murderous rejection of the blessing of children and of God's design for marriage and sexual union. Ps. 139:13ff Ex. 20:13
- 5. Acceptance and promotion of homosexuality along with other deviant lifestyles is the final step into moral degradation.
- B. The growing wickedness of our culture is God's judgment upon us. Rom. 1:20-32
  - 1. Moral impurity is the consequence of failing to worship and honor God. v. 20-25
  - 2. Sexual anarchy is the result of religious apostasy as God gives them over to unnatural, shameful and degrading passions v. 26-28
  - 3. Homosexuality is an unnatural deviation, a disoriented expression of rebellion against God and His order for mankind. Lev. 20:15 18:22
  - 4. Deep down, those who defy God know their sinful acts deserve wrath. v. 32a
  - 5. Yet they harden themselves and shamelessly celebrate their sin. v. 32b Isa. 5:20 3:9
  - 6. The result will be more Divine judgment. Ge. 19 Lev. 18:22-25 Ga. 6:7-8 Jude 1:7
- C. There is cause for concern about the state of marriage within the church. I Pet. 4:17
- D. The biggest problems with family values in America will not be solved by legislation.

# IV. The gospel offers hope for homosexuals (and other sinners). I Cor. 6:9-10

- A. What should our attitude be towards homosexuals? Mt. 11:19
  - 1. We should not fear or hate them.
  - 2. We should have compassion upon those who struggle against this temptation.
  - 3. Our goal is not to merely turn homosexuals into heterosexuals but rather to transform them into holy servants of Christ.
- B. Why are people homosexual?
  - 1. God does not create anyone to be homosexual. Mt. 19:4 Gen. 1:27
  - 2. Nor is anyone forced into homosexuality by his environment. Mark 7:21
  - 3. Certain people, because of nature or environment, may more be tempted by this particular sin; just as some are especially tempted by other sins. Ro. 1:29-31
  - 4. We are all oriented to sin. Rom. 3:23 8:7-8
  - 5. Homosexuality is a choice. Ro. 1:27
- C. Hope begins when homosexuality is acknowledged as sin because God forgives and transforms sinners of all kinds. I Co. 6:9-10
  - 1. Homosexuality is not the unforgivable sin. Ps. 51:4
  - 2. Christ sets us free from slavery to sin -- such were you. Rom. 6:11ff II Co. 5:17
  - 3. We all need God's grace. I Co. 6:10
