## Exposition of Revelation Overcomers Inherit (21:7-8)

He who overcomes will inherit these things
 Overcomes – victor, conqueror

1. Christ as the Conqueror
Past victory - Jn. 16:33; Rev. 5:5;
Future victory - Rev. 17:14

2. Overcoming, conquering is paradox.

Those who overcome are those who suffer, are persecuted, and even die. Rev. 12:11; 13:7

3. The present participle "continuing characteristic of the genuine believer."

Overcome the devil (1 Jn. 2:12-13; Rev. 12:10-11; 15:2)

Overcome antichrists (1 Jn. 4:4)

Overcome the world (1 Jn. 5:4)

Over sin and compromise (Rev. 2-3)

Overcoming is a metaphor for the life of faith itself (1 Jn. 5:5)

## II. Will inherit these things

A. Mt. 5:5; 19:29; 25:34; 1 Cor. 6:9-10; 15:50; Gal. 5:19-21; Heb 6:10-12; 1 Pet. 1:4-5

B. "All the promises made to the overcomers in the letters section (chs. 2 and 3) are fulfilled in this closing section, which describes the new Jerusalem and the eternal reward of the believer:

"the tree of life, which is in the Paradise of God" (2:7 and 22:2),

inclusion in the new temple (3:12 and 21:22ff.),

participation in "the new Jerusalem, which comes down out of heaven from my God" (3:12 and 21:2, 10),

God's name written on one's person (3:12 and 22:4),

one's name written in the book of life (3:5 and 21:27),

bright garments as a reward (3:5 and 21:2, 9ff.; cf. 19:7–8),

a bright stone and a luminary, whether star or lamp (2:17, 28 and 21:11, 18–21, 23; 22:5, 16),

consummate reigning with Christ (2:26–27; 3:21 and 22:5), and exclusion from the second death (2:11; 21:7–8).<sup>1</sup>

- C. Covenant promise consummated (2 Sam. 7:14)
- III. Who Doesn't Inherit (8)
  - A. cowardly Mt 8:26; Mk 4:40
  - B. unbelieving not just unbelievers, but those with an empty faith or who abandoned faith
  - C. abominable to detest someth because it is utterly offensive or loathsome, abhor, detest τὶ someth
  - D. murderers Beale, agents of the beast and harlot who persecuted the saints (1 John 3:15)
  - E. immoral persons sexually immoral (Heb 13:4; 1 Cor. 6:9 etc
  - F. sorcerers φάρμακος one skilled in arcane uses of herbs or drugs,
     ② one who does extraordinary things through occult means, sorcerer, magician²
  - G. idolaters image worship idol worship (1 Cor. 5:10; Eph. 5:5)
  - H. all liars 1 Jn 2:4, 22; 4:20; 5:10 Compromised behavior, false doctrine, hypocrites Prov. 6:17

Their part shall be in the lake that burns with fire and brimstone Which is the second death.

The eternal state of punishment – 14:10-11; 19:20; 20:10
