## Who are the Blessed Servants?

I. Those who wait on their Lord II. Those who are waited upon by their Lord.

- I. They are blessed servants who are found waiting their Master
- A. What in general is meant with *waiting*?
  - 1. It is not *I-do-nothing-but-wait*
  - 2. It is *I will not let Thee go, except thou bless me* (Gen. 32:26) a. Is. 30:15; Ps. 130:5-6; Gen. 49:18; Phil. 3:20; 1 Thess. 1:10; 2 Thess. 3:5
    - b. Jesus commands His Church to 'watch and wait' (Mark 13:33, 35, 37)
- B. What is *this waiting* on the Master or Lord? (vs. 35)
- C. Who are the *blessed* among the Master's servants?1. Those who the Master *will not surprise upon His return (vs. 36b & 38)* 
  - 2. Why are they blessed?
    - a. for they are in a healthy, spiritual condition
    - b. for they are in for exceeding unusual and unexpected blessing
- II. They are blessed servants who are waited upon by their Master
- A. Jesus calls special attention to this detail: vs. 37
  - 1. Vs. 36 indicates the *master is as a wedding elsewhere* a. This pictures the truth of the ascended Savior & stay-behind-church

- 2. Vs. 37a indicates an unexpected return
- 3. Vs. 37b reveals a *stunning truth* about the glory of Jesus' return
- B. This confirms *Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, and today, and forever.*1. He came to serve and He will come to serve (Luke 22:27; Rev. 17:7)
