New members to FCCW take the following vows:

- I also resolve to learn the will of God, known or to be made known, as taught in the Holy Scriptures, and to walk in the ways of the Lord.
- I do covenant with this church to attend its services, to support its activities and missions, to pray and labor for its growth in grace, and to walk worthily with you in its communion of worship and work.

The Membership of the church, likewise takes part in the covenant saying:

CONCLUSION: Paul and Timothy loved their brothers and sisters in Christ at the congregation in Philippi. In the midst of great difficulty while in prison in Rome, they wrote to these dear saints to thank and encourage them. They customize the etiquette of the day to remind them even in their greetings that Christ has transformed every aspect of their lives together for His glory. Let us consider how we can motivate one another to delight in the new life won for us in Christ.

Romans 16:1-27

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a servant of the church at Cenchreae, ² that you may welcome her in the Lord in a way worthy of the saints, and help her in whatever she may need from you, for she has been a patron of many and of myself as well.

³ Greet Prisca and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus, ⁴ who risked their necks for my life, to whom not only I give thanks but all the churches of the Gentiles give thanks as well. ⁵ Greet also the church in their house. Greet my beloved Epaenetus, who was the first convert to Christ in Asia. ⁶ Greet Mary, who has worked hard for you. ⁷ Greet Andronicus and Junia, my kinsmen and my fellow prisoners. They are well known to the apostles, and they were in Christ before me. ⁸ Greet Ampliatus, my beloved in the Lord. ⁹ Greet Urbanus, our fellow worker in Christ, and my beloved Stachys. ¹⁰ Greet Apelles, who is approved in Christ. Greet those who belong to the family of Aristobulus. ¹¹ Greet my kinsman Herodion. Greet those in the Lord who belong to the family of Narcissus. ¹² Greet those workers in the Lord, Tryphaena and Tryphosa. Greet the beloved Persis, who has worked hard in the Lord. ¹³ Greet Rufus, chosen in the Lord; also his mother, who has been a mother to me as well. ¹⁴ Greet Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas, Hermas, and the brothers who are with them. ¹⁵ Greet Philologus, Julia, Nereus and his sister, and Olympas, and all the saints who are with them. ¹⁶ Greet one another with a holy kiss. *All the churches of Christ greet you*.

¹⁷ I appeal to you, brothers, to watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; avoid them. ¹⁸ For such persons do not serve our Lord Christ, but their own appetites, and by smooth talk and flattery they deceive the hearts of the naive. ¹⁹ For your obedience is known to all, so that I rejoice over you, but I want you to be wise as to what is good and innocent as to what is evil. ²⁰ *The God of peace* will soon crush Satan under your feet. *The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you.*

- ²¹ Timothy, my fellow worker, greets you; so do Lucius and Jason and Sosipater, my kinsmen.
- ²² I Tertius, who wrote this letter, greet you in the Lord.
- ²³ Gaius, who is host to me and to the whole church, greets you. Erastus, the city treasurer, and our brother Quartus, greet you.
- ²⁵ Now to him who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel and the preaching of Jesus Christ, according to the revelation of the mystery that was kept secret for long ages ²⁶ but has now been disclosed and through the prophetic writings has been made known to all nations, according to the command of the eternal God, to bring about the obedience of faith—²⁷ to the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ! Amen.

First Corinthians 16:16-20

¹⁶ be subject to such as these, and to every fellow worker and laborer. ¹⁷I rejoice at the coming of Stephanas and Fortunatus and Achaicus, because they have made up for your absence, ¹⁸ for they refreshed my spirit as well as yours. Give recognition to such people.

READ Philippians 1:1-2; Romans 16:1-27; First Corinthians 16:16-20; Galatians 6:1-10; Numbers 6:22-27. DISCUSS How had God prepared the congregation in Philippi to help Paul and one another? How do we tend to operate autonomously? PRAY "Lord Christ, teach us to trust You with all of our lives. Holy Spirit, open our eyes to Your purposes."

Sunday Evening

Monday

READ **Philippians 1:1-2**; **Romans 16:1-27**. DISCUSS How do we see members of the congregation(s) in Rome interacting? How has God called us to encourage one another? MEDITATE on **First Thessalonians 5:11**. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, thank You for our brothers and sisters at FCCW. Help us to encourage one another."

Tuesday

READ Philippians 1:1-2; First Corinthians 16:16-20. DISCUSS What is the "service of the saints" spoken of here? How are we responsible for one another? How are we responsible for ourselves? MEDITATE on First Thessalonians 5:11. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for Your faithfulness in giving us all we need. Guide us, Holy Spirit."

Wednesday

READ **Philippians 1:1-2**; **Galatians 6:1-10**. DISCUSS, how are we to bear one another's burdens? What does it mean then that each is bear their own load? Why? MEDITATE on **First Thessalonians 5:11**. PRAY, "Lord, thank You for providing us all that we need together as a family at FCCW. Teach us to appreciate and encourage one another."

Thursday

READ **Philippians 1:1-2**; **Numbers 6:22-27**. DISCUSS, How are we to greet one another? How can this Aaronic blessing instruct us? MEDITATE on **First Thessalonians 5:11**. PRAY, Lord, thank You for adopting us into a family and setting us apart for Your purposes."

Friday

READ Philippians 1:1-2; Romans 16:1-27; First Corinthians 16:16-20; Galatians 6:1-10; Numbers 6:22-27. DISCUSS, How has God been teaching you from these passages this week? REJOICE if Christ has given you the honor to be identified among His people! MEDITATE on **First Thessalonians 5:11**. PRAY for renewal and revival across our land.

Saturday

PREPARE today for the worship service tomorrow. *There will be both in- person and live-stream services available*. READ **Philippians 1:1-30**. Invite others to join you tomorrow. Ask Jesus to make us reflect His holiness together.
