(The Prayer Hand As A Diagnostic Tool)

EPH 6:16 in addition to all, taking up the shield of faith with which you will be able to extinguish all the flaming missiles of the evil one.

- *I.* Since Faith and Prayer are linked... (when did faith change from our trusting God to our getting God to do our will?)
- God is not what we believe, by Faith we believe what God is as revealed in His Holy Word
- God's will is not what we believe, by Faith we believe God's will as revealed in His Holy Word.
- God does not do what we believe, rather by Faith we believe what God does as revealed in His Holy Word.
- By a word of faith command, God does not do our bidding, rather by faith in the commands of His Holy Word we do His bidding.
- Faith is not the ability to get God to act on our behalf, rather by faith we believe that He has acted and is acting on our behalf and trust in His sovereign, good and holy will. By faith we act on God's behalf and are at His beck and call, not vice versa.
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II. How We Pray Is Important To God ...

Prayer is more than Confession & Supplication (Health, jobs and relationships)

A. Error revealed in popular song, "You don't have to know how to pray, you don't have to know what to say, as long as you say *Jesus*" - Nothing could be further from the truth (Mark 5:7; James 2:19; 4:3 vs. Romans 1:5; 16:26)

B. Deut 12:13,14; 14:23; 16:5,6 God not man defines prayer and worship, what is and is not important in worship, how, when and where to worship. Man has never been free to worship God in any way he chooses.

The Sword of the Spirit (Word) Shield of faith (trusting and obeying Romans 1:5; 16:26 Jesus / The Word of God). If satan can engage us in miracles and spiritism contests rather than spiritual warfare being the obedience of faith he will win.
- Ephesians 2:1-3 vs Ephesians 5:1-5 resisting satan by manifesting moral excellence in contrast with our previous fleshly state.
- I Peter 2:11 man would much rather engage in miracle contests than live a life of moral excellence.
- I Timothy 6:9 man would much rather engage in miracle contests than living a life of trusting God rather than seeking riches. You can get rich doing miracle crusades but no one gets rich preaching Jesus and repentance.
- I Corinthians 10:13 we will be attacked but we can overcome. The Holy Scripture says that where temptations and attacks by satan increase so does God's grace. It does not say, where irresponsibility increases, so does God's grace.
- We learn from Job that satan is on a short leash (Job 1:8-12), but a foolish man will approach a lion on a short leash to the man's destruction.
- Rather than witnessing, mastering the Word of God and maintaining a high standard of moral excellence, satan would rather us become preoccupied with miracle contests and mysticism.

 They were in the Law,

 do they continue or are they fulfilled like confessing sins to priest and animal sacrifices

 Matthew 6:16-18

 Fasting continues: "When you fast"

 Sackcloth and ashes are fulfilled: "anoint your head and wash your face...not be noticed by men"

- Is fasting more powerful than the name of Jesus? *I Timothy 2:5; Hebrews 4:14-16* Is anything mentioned besides Jesus?
 Do we need anything besides Jesus to approach God and the Throne of Grace?
 - Does there exist a set of second-class Christians who do not fast and only pray in the name of Jesus? The answer
 - is a resounding "no". Ephesians 1:3

3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ,

2 Peter 1:3,4

3 seeing that His divine power has granted to us everything pertaining to life and godliness, through the true knowledge of Him who called us by His own glory and excellence. 4 For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust.

• Is fasting a good way to mortify the flesh and gain victory over it?

Colossians 2:20-23 contrasted John 17:17 Joshua 1:8 John 14:15

 By fasting do we prod God to action by showing Him how we are willing to suffer for this request? Hebrews 10:18 Isaiah 53:5 Isaiah 53:11

• What then is fasting?

Going without food for a set period of time 2 Samuel 12:21 21 Then his servants said to him, "What is this thing that you have done? While the child was alive, you fasted and wept; but when the child died, you arose and ate food

- Will God judge you for breaking your fast?
- Is there a difference between "Lent" and fasting?

1 Timothy 6:17 17 Instruct those who are rich in this present world not to be conceited or to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy.

- Can we "fast" from an activity or a specific food? No, we enjoy those things which God has blessed us and we repent and lay aside sin.
- Do we prove our love for God by giving up, setting aside or doing away with something He has given us? No
- Does God require us to "give up" something we like in order to prove our dedication and commitment to Him? I Timothy 6:17; Philippians 4:12
- Can we fast, repent and confess the sins of others in the New Covenant? No, we cannot repent for another, confess the sins for another, receive Christ for another nor be baptized for another. Daniel 9:5, 20 vs I Timothy 2:5

Matthew 6:7-8 7 "And when you are praying, <u>do not use meaningless repetition</u> as the Gentiles do, for they suppose that they will be heard for their many words. 8 "So do not be like them; for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him.

1 Kings 18:26-28 26 Then they took the ox which was given them and they prepared it and called on the name of Baal from morning until noon saying, "O Baal, answer us." But there was no voice and no one answered. And they leaped about the altar which they made. 27 It came about at noon, that Elijah mocked them and said, "Call out with a loud voice, for he is a god; either he is occupied or gone aside, or is on a journey, or perhaps he is asleep and needs to be awakened." 28 So they cried with <u>a loud voice and cut themselves</u> according to their custom with swords and lances until the blood gushed out on them.
