Wondering What in the World?

But the fact of the matter is, God never said it would be easy for them, He never gave them a time frame to work with, and while He did give Moses quite a bit of information, He did not divulge all the details of His plan. He simply made the promise to put Pharoah in his place and deliver His people from bondage and take them into the promised land. This is not only a foretaste of the experiences of the Lord's witnessing Christ's passion, but there is also personal application for us as well. Things looked pretty grim as Jesus approached the cross – but we know the infinite value of what was accomplished there. As for us, God has promised us His blessings in this life and has assured His people of a blissful eternity, but sometimes we are perplexed by how things pan out. We may not feel especially blessed at times as things don't always go the way or unfold in the time frame that we prefer. But our God is true, and His promises, His ways and His timing is all perfect and we can trust Him at all times.
