## The Church Paul Loved (1 Corinthians 16:13-24)

#### I. Introduction: The 'church militant:' An imperfect church

- A. Corinth was a church that was far from perfect, but Paul loved them anyway
- B. Read the text and pray
- C. Indifference toward the church
  - 1. Bonhoeffer quote
  - 2. Excuses for people's indifference
    - a. the church is indeed imperfect (Eph 2:21-22)
    - b. Christ's promise to the church (Mt 16:18) does not mean that the church is infallible.
- D. Outline of sermon: *How then are we to love an imperfect church?*

# II. We love the church by being strong and standing firm in truth (vss 13-14)

- A. The command to *do everything in love* is couched in the previous four imperatives calling for **strength**.
  - 1. Love is not keeping silent or being weak
  - 2. Love is standing up for the truth
    - a. and illustration from the 'Duck Dynasty' spectacle

## III. We love the church by serving one another (vss. 15-20)

- A. The example of the household of Stephanas (vss 15-16)
  - 1. they devoted themselves to a life of selfless service
  - 2. be subject to such individuals in the church
    - a. the one who is greatest, is the servant of all (Mt 23:11-12, Mk 9:35)
  - 3. Follow those servants in our own midst
- B. Stephanas served and refreshed Paul by visiting him (vss. 17-18)
  - 1. The blessing of an personal audience
  - 2. If you do not wish to love in this manner, examine yourself to be sure you are in the faith (1 John 4:7-11, 20-21)
- C. The warm hearty greeting of Aquila and Prisca (vss. 19-20)
  - 1. A holy kiss ... a holy greeting
    - a. warmly greet one another in church
    - b. use your Sundays to get to know EVERYONE
    - c. use your 'prayer lists' to reach out during the week

### IV. We love the church by first loving Christ (vss. 21-24)

- A. Side points: Paul's own hand (v. 21) & Maranatha (v. 22)
- B. Malediction: The curse of having no love for Jesus
  - 1. We love others by first loving Christ
  - 2. What if your love doesn't measure up?
- C. Benediction: The Gospel of *grace* (v. 23)
- D. Paul loved a church that by all rights he could have been angry at
  - 1. Savor 'Christ Jesus' the Lord of the church!
