**Hebrews 4:1-11**

**PASTOR'S PRAYER**

*Almighty God of work and rest, You laid the foundations of the world. You finished all your work and on the seventh day rested from all your work. Lord, grant your Spirit to come this morning with the same power and authority of that first creation day when the Spirit of God hovered over the face of the waters in the midst of the dark, formless deep; you spoke and all things came into being. This morning, Lord, come again in your power and authority and speak into our midst that you might create hearts of awe filled fear from unbelief. **Central Textual Truth**

*While there remains a rest for the Hebrews they are to fear unbelief & strive toward obedience so that they might enter his rest.*

**Central Sermon Aim**

*I want to encourage SGBC to so fear unbelief & so strive toward obedience that they may enter God's rest which remains for us today.*
