

THE FAMILY: FORGOTTEN IDOL! (p.2)

1 Samuel 2:29 Wherefore kick ye at my sacrifice and at mine offering, which I have commanded in my habitation; and honourest thy sons above me...?

Luke 18:29 And he said unto them, Verily I say unto you, There is no man that hath left house, or parents, or brethren, or wife, or children, for the kingdom of God's sake, 30 Who shall not receive manifold more in this present time, and in the world to come life everlasting.

Luke 14:26 If any man come to me, and hate not his father, and mother, and wife, and children, and brethren, and sisters, yea, and his own life also, he cannot be my disciple.

John Glas (1761):

"...a man may make an idol of his wife, and of his children (whom the Gospel commands him to love), by loving them beyond the limits of God's law, or with that love that is due to God alone: but a man's retaining his wife (except in the case wherein he must either give up with God or her) can never be made a proof of his making her his idol; at least, it cannot be a proof of it by the Gospel, which forbids him to put her away, or to leave her."

Frederick W. Faber (1860):

"...idolatry of family ties which nowadays wages such a vigorous warfare against the manliness of Christian sanctity."

The Friend of Youth, and Child's Magazine (1862):

"Some people make money their god. Some make eating and drinking their god. Sometimes a husband will make an idol of his wife; or she will make an idol out of a husband."

Dwight L. Moody (d. 1899):

"People who live in America think there is no such thing as idolatry...Don't flatter yourselves... A man may make an idol of his wife or children..."

R.A. Torrey (1924):

"The third hindrance to prayer is found in Ez. 14:3...IDOLS IN THE HEART CAUSE GOD TO REFUSE TO LISTEN TO OUR PRAYERS...."

"God alone has the right to the supreme place in our hearts. Everything and everyone else must be subordinate to Him."

"Many a man makes an idol of his wife....he can put her in the wrong place, he can put her before God; and when a man regards his wife's pleasure before God's pleasure, when he gives her the first place and God the second place, his wife is an idol, and God cannot hear his prayers."

"Many a woman makes an idol of her children...The more dearly we love Christ, the more dearly we love our children; but we can put our children in the wrong place, we can put them before God, and their interests before God's interests. When we do this our children are our idols."

"Never have so many children killed their parents and never have so many parents killed their children. We are so confused that the courts are filled with children who have called the hot-line to accuse their parents of abuse and with parents turning their children over to the state for care via some psychiatric diagnosis...When the family takes precedence and becomes the center of focus, it is idolatry..."
