II. The Measurements of the New Jerusalem (21:15-17)

A. Angel with a gold measuring rod to measure the city, its walls, and its gates

This measuring of the city-temple here figuratively represents the placing of God's boundaries around the city by which it is protected from harm and from the entrance of any form of evil¹

B. The city is laid out as a square
Its length is as great as its width
NASB 1,500 miles (NET, 1,400 miles)
ESV, 12,000 stadia
