A Survey of Church History, Part 50f: Hendrik De Cock



N THE UNFOLDING of the committee's inquiry, the Classis convened and De Cock earnestly implored for the opportunity to defend his convictions grounded in Scripture. Yet, his plea was denied, and in a meeting deemed unlaw-

ful, he found himself suspended from office. The justification given was to uphold law and order within the Reformed Church, safeguard the honor of Gospel ministers, and forestall further disruptions, divisions, and upheavals in congregations across our homeland. The apprehension expressed by the Board was clear: a concern that unless preachers like De Cock were halted in their daring pursuits, dire consequences loomed ahead.

As the gears of ecclesiastical proceedings turned, De Cock submitted to his suspension, refraining from his pulpit. Yet, as the case navigated through the various assemblies, another layer unfolded—the matter of hymn singing. De Cock had penned the preface to a pamphlet where a layman critiqued hymn singing in the church. The pamphlet's title is captivating: "The Evangelical Hymns Weighed, Tested and Found to be Too Light." De Cock held that heresy had found its way into the church through hymns, displacing the Psalms in worship services.

As tensions escalated, a pivotal moment unfolded. Scholte (who later established a settlement in Pella, Iowa!), a supporter of De Cock, was barred from preaching in favor of a modernist taking the pulpit. The congregation, displeased with this turn of events, resisted vehemently, prompting authorities to intervene and prevent what nearly erupted into a riot.

Enduring nearly a year with patient humility under the weight of an unlawful suspension by the Classis, De Cock found himself the target of animosity. His colleagues spared no effort to cast shadows on his life, spreading slander about him and his wife. The ecclesiastical assemblies, far from offering a fair hearing, compelled him to bear the financial burden of their case against him. Unyielding, they demanded his unconditional submission, threatening to silence him permanently if he resisted. When he sought a transcript of the decision, he was mockingly instructed to transcribe it himself, the president openly ridiculing him as he undertook the task.

Yet, the devoted people of God across the land were deeply troubled to witness the mistreatment of an honest and godly pastor, who merely sought to uphold faithfulness to the historic Reformed faith. In heaven, God, in His sovereign wisdom, orchestrated the necessary steps to preserve and safeguard His church.


