## Imputation

here is only one imputation. It exclusively occurred at the cross of the LORD Jesus Christ. It was strictly a judicial act. The result was God declaring all the elect of all time to be righteous in His sight (<u>Rom. 4:25</u>; <u>5:1</u>). God ratified this one-time declaration of righteousness by raising Christ from the dead. The resurrection of Christ was objective proof positive to the elect of the finished justification of all those in Christ. Until Christ would come, God did forbear with and did pass over the sins of all the Old Testament saints, including Abraham, <u>Rom. 3:25</u>. For without the shedding of

blood there is no remission. Likewise, His attribute of forbearance also permitted a reckoning of the Faith by promise, which Faith was the objective contents of Faith meaning Christ Himself and His future coming to bring in that everlasting righteousness that God would at long last impute to the elect upon the establishment of it, <u>Rom. 4:3-13</u>; <u>Gal. 3:18</u>. Like Abraham, all Old Testament saints believed the promise of that one true righteousness TO BE established by the LORD Jesus Christ in their behalf, <u>John 8:56</u>. New Testament saints look back to that one time declared righteousness. WHAT Abraham believed (i.e., THE Faith), God did impute to him for his righteousness, <u>Rom. 4:3-9</u>. And God did that without any condition to Abraham, <u>Rom. 4:2</u>. What God did by PROMISE for OT saints was actually accomplished and declared to be so upon the death of Christ, <u>Rom. 4:25</u>. This is precisely what the resurrection signified: righteousness imputed and sin not imputed resulting in finished justification at the cross of Christ.

#### The Gospel is the Power of God "I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God unto salvation...." (Romans 1:16)

Any have a form of godliness that is nothing more than man's attempts at satisfying God's holiness or simply trying to appear as upright and moral before others. While morality may help us live better lives here on earth; it in no way is evidence of right standing with God. To be right with God, mere morality will not suffice. It requires absolute holiness and righteousness before God. Here is where we read in the Bible that there is only one Way that sinners can have perfect standing before a Holy God and that is by the just satisfaction of God's law by the death of the LORD Jesus Christ for sinners. Romans 1:17 teaches that in the Gospel, the very righteousness (justice) of God is revealed from Faith to Faith, having been imputed at the cross. Those to whom God has revealed salvation by His Spirit have been given Faith to look to the LORD Jesus Christ alone and see in Him and His obedience unto death, ALL their righteousness before God. They stand justified by Him alone in His shed blood unto death alone!

This Gospel of Christ is the Power of God unto salvation. Christ Himself is Salvation and therefore the sum and substance of the Gospel. Christ declared the Gospel as the revelation of Himself [Luke 24:27] and His work of salvation that He came to accomplish for those sinners that the Father chose and gave Him to save before the foundation of the world, John 17:2. By this, God has purposed to quicken those for whom Christ died. In the Gospel is God's Power through the Spirit to enLighten blind eyes, unstop deaf ears, soften hard hearts and make His enemies His friends.

## The Righteousness that FAITH Eyes

A dam was created upright but fallible. The righteousness about which FAITH is exercised is the righteousness of God and therefore cannot fail, <u>Romans 3:21; 10:3</u>. Adam's uprightness was a mutable one that might be sinned away and was but the righteousness about which the believer's FAITH is exercised is an everlasting righteousness, a righteousness that cannot be sinned away, <u>2 Corinthians 5:21; Proverbs 8:18</u>; "Seventy weeks are determined upon thy people and upon thy holy city, to finish the transgression, and to make an end of sins, and to make reconciliation for iniquity, and to bring in everlasting righteousness, and to seal up the vision and prophecy, and to anoint the most holy." (Daniel 9:24); "Thy righteousness is an everlasting righteousness and thy law is the truth." (Psalm 119:142)

The uprightness of Adam was subject to shaking, and we know that Satan did so tempt him to the point of disobedience. But the glorious righteousness about which FAITH is conversant is an unshaken righteousness, a righteousness that cannot be shaken: *"Thy righteousness is like the great mountains..."* (Psalm 36:6) or as in the Hebrew, *"Thy righteousness is like the mountains of God..."* What is more stable than a mountain! And what mountain so stable as the mountain of God! The mountains cannot be shaken and no more can that glorious righteousness that Christ earned and established be shaken nor those who by God's Grace are stayed on Him through God-given FAITH.
