  - Start Looking At:
    - Some Of The "Psalms, Hymns, And Spiritual Songs" Through Which:
      - We Can Learn So Much:
        - When It Comes To:
          - Our Christian Faith!

- Last Sunday:
  - We Were Introduced To:
    - The First Hymnwriter:
      - That We Will Look At This Year!
  - And That Is:
    - John Newton:
      - The Pastor & Author Of:
        - Of One Of The Most Famous Hymns In English:
          - Amazing Grace!

- 2. Well Newton Wrote:
  - Several Hundred Other Hymns:
    - That Were Published Along With:
      - Many Of The Hymns Written By His Friend:
        - William Cowper:
          - In The Late 1700's In Three Volumes Titled:
            - "Olney Hymns!"
    - Olney Was The Small Village In England:
      - Where Newton Served And Preached!
  - Well Even Though:
    - Amazing Grace:
      - Only Became Popular:
        - Some 50 Years After:
          - Newton Lived!
      - And Especially:
        - In America And:
          - Among The Slave Communities In The South!
    - There Is One Hymn:
      - That He Wrote:
        - That Was One Of The Most Popular:
          - In His Own Lifetime!
- 3. And That Is The Hymn:
  - We Will Be Looking At Tonight:
    - Which Was Titled By Newton As:
      - "The Name Of Jesus!"
  - The Title It Usually Goes By Today:
    - Is The First Line Of The Hymn:
      - "How Sweet The Name Of Jesus Sounds!"
  - Now One Of The Best Things:
    - About Newton's Hymns:
      - Is That We Can Know Both When & Why:
        - He Wrote Just About:
          - Every One Of Them!
    - Because He Would Often Write A Hymn:
      - That Went Along With:
        - The Message He Would Preach:
          - In His Church The Following Sunday!
- 4. So When It Comes To:
  - This Hymn He Wrote It:

- As He Was Studying & Meditating On:
  - A Verse From The Song Of Solomon:
    - Which Throughout Church History:
      - Was Understood As A Book About The Love Of Christ:
        - And His Bride, The Church!
- He Even Told His Church That:
  - "A Chief Part Of This Little Book (The Song Of Solomon) Is An Attempt To Answer That Question: What Is thy Beloved More Than Another Beloved!"
    - And Who Is A Christian's Beloved?
      - The Lord Jesus Christ!
- And So His Theme Verse:
  - For His Message On March 3, 1765:
    - Was Song Of Solomon 1:3:
      - "Because of the savour of thy good ointments thy name [is as] ointment poured forth, therefore do the virgins love thee!"
  - John Newton Used This Verse:
    - To Remind His Congregation:
      - About The Precious Name Of Jesus:
        - Even As We've Been Singing About Tonight:
          - From The Hymns Of Others!

- 5. Now We Even Have:
  - The Message Notes:
    - That Newton Used:
      - To Preach Through This Verse!
    - And When You Compare:
      - The Text Of His Notes With:
        - The Text Of His Hymn:
          - They Are Very Closely Aligned!
    - So Much So That:
      - To Sing His Hymn:
        - Is To Almost Hear:
          - His Sermon!
  - And Just Like Many Messages:
    - That Have Been Preached By Pastors:
      - Over The Years Newton Considered:
        - Three Main Points:
          - From His Text!
  - His First Point Was What Is Meant By:
    - "Thy Name" In Song Of Solomon 1:3!
      - And The Name Was:
        - The Name Of Christ!
    - In His Message He Said:
      - "The name of Christ includes the whole revelation concerning him, who he is, what he has done all that we read of his love, his power and his offices make a part of his great and glorious name!"
    - And So He Focused On:
      - Three Biblical Names & Descriptions:
        - Of Jesus Including:
          - Savior!
          - Mediator! And:
          - Husband!
  - Newton's Second Point Was:
    - Why The Name Of Jesus:
      - Would Be Compared To Ointment:
        - In Song Of Solomon 1:3!
          - Where It Says "Thy Name Is As Ointment!"
    - And He Shared How:
      - Christ Himself:
        - Is Like An Ointment Or Medicine!

- In That Because Of His Name:
  - He Is Able To Heal & Revive & Refresh:
    - Those Who Believe In Him!
- Because Only Jesus Is Able To:
  - Make Sinners Whole:
    - From Their Sin!
- Newton's Third Point Was:
  - How Jesus' Ointment:
    - Was Poured Forth:
      - In Order To Do His Saving Work!
  - And Just As:
    - The Woman In Mark 14 Had To:
      - First Break Open Her Alabaster Box Of Ointment:
        - Before The Contents Could Be Poured Out Upon Jesus!
  - So Jesus Himself Had To Be Broken:
    - Through His Suffering & Sacrifice:
      - On The Cross Before The:
        - Healing Power Of His Name:
          - Could Be Poured Out Upon Us!
  - In Newton's Own Words:
    - "The precious vessel that contained this precious ointment was broken upon the Cross the savor of his name, his love, his blood, poured out from every wound [in] his sacred body!"
      - And Then Newton Even Quotes From A Hymn Written By Isaac Watts:
        - Written Earlier That Century, And One That We Still Sing Today, And Even Sang Today!
    - From "When I Survey The Wondrous Cross!"
      - Newton Urged His Church:
        - To "See from his head, his hands, his feet, sorrow and love flow mingling down!"
          - And "From that hour it was quickly spread and diffused far and near!"
- 6. And So This Was Newton's Message!
  - And As We Read His Hymn:
    - We Can Hear It In These Words!
      - Let's Look At It Together!
        - Read Hymn:

How sweet the name of Jesus sounds In a believer's ear. It soothes his sorrows, heals his wounds And drives away his fear.

It makes the wounded spirit whole And calms the troubled breast; 'Tis manna to the hungry soul And to the weary rest.

Dear name! the rock on which I build, My shield and hiding place; My never-failing treasury filled With boundless stores of grace.

By Thee my prayers acceptance gain Altho' with sin defiled; Satan accuses me in vain And I am owned a child.

Jesus! my Shepherd, Husband, Friend,

My Prophet, Priest and King; My Lord, my Life, my Way, my End, Accept the praise I bring.

Weak is the effort of my heart And cold my warmest thought; But when I see Thee as Thou art I'll praise Thee as I ought.

'Till then I would Thy love proclaim With every fleeting breath; And may the music of Thy name Refresh my soul in death.

- Now It Is Clear From:
  - These Words That:
    - Newton Wanted To:
      - Make Much Of The Doctrine:
        - Of Christ!
  - And So In The Time We Have Left:
    - I Want Us To Focus On A Few:
      - Of Those Doctrines:
        - That Are Reflected in This Hymn, But Are Also Clearly Drawn From:
          - Scripture!
- And The Title I Gave:
  - To Tonight's Message:
    - Is From The Words We Find:
      - In That Final Stanza:
        - Of His Hymn:
          - "The Music Of Thy Name!"
  - Because Just Like The Best Music:
    - There Is Great Beauty:
      - In The Name & Nature:
        - Of Jesus!
- 7. But What Does His Name Mean?
  - Well In Matthew 1:21 When An Angel Of The Lord;
    - Appeared To Joseph In A Dream:
      - He Told Him That Mary His Future Wife:
        - "Shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins!"
  - The Name Of Jesus:
    - Means "Jehovah Saves" Or:
      - "Jehovah Is Salvation!"
        - It Is The Same Name Given To:
          - Joshua In The Old Testament!
    - And So The Very Purpose:
      - Of Jesus From The Beginning:
        - Was & Is To Save & Deliver & Rescue:
          - Sinners Which We All Are!
            - From Our Sin!
    - And All The Ways:
      - That Jesus Does This:
        - Is Like A Music All Its Own!
          - With Every Note In Perfect Harmony:
            - With Each Other!
  - And So There Are Four Key Doctrines:
    - About Christ That I Think:
      - Newton Captures In This:

- Beautiful Hymn!

- \* The First Note In The Music Of His Name Is That:
- 1. Jesus Is A Sympathetic Savior!
  - This Is Something That We Find:
    - In Hebrews 4:15 Where We Are Told:
      - "For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as [we are, yet] without sin!"
        - So Jesus Is A Sympathetic Savior:
          - Who Can Be & Always Is:
            - "Touched With The Feeling Of Our Infirmities!"
  - And So The Name Of Jesus;:
    - Is Able To Bring The Ointment:
      - Of Relief:
        - To Everyone Who Has The Conditions:
          - That Newton Describes In The First Two Stanzas Of His Hymn!
    - Conditions That All Stem From:
      - Our Sinful Nature And:
        - The Fallen World:
          - In Which We Live!
      - Jesus Is The Great Physician:
        - For All Of The:
          - Sorrows & Wounds & Fears:
            - That We Find In The First Verse!
        - As Well As For All:
          - The Troubles & Hunger & Weariness That We All Face:
            - In This World:
              - Described In The Second Verse!

- And Jesus Can Cure:
  - Because Jesus Cares!
    - He Is A Sympathetic Savior!
- \* The Second Note In The Music Of His Name Is That:
- 2. Jesus Is A Sovereign Savior!
  - This Is Something We Find:
    - In 2 Samuel 22:3 Where We Are Told About:
      - "The God of my rock; in him will I trust: [he is] my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my high tower, and my refuge, my savior; thou savest me from violence!"
    - All This Jesus Is Because:
      - Jesus Is God Come In The Flesh!
  - And So The Name Of Jesus:
    - As The Sovereign Savior:
      - Is Able To Be:
        - All The Refuge You Need:
          - In This World Of Hardship & Hate!
    - This Too Is Something:
      - That Newton Reminds Us Of:
        - With Some Old Testament

References To God:

- In The Third Verse!
- All The Power & Strength You Need:
  - God Will Provide:
    - Because He Is The "Rock" On Which:
      - You Can Build!
- All The Protection You Need:
  - God Will Provide:
    - Because He Is Your "Shield" And "Hiding Place!"
- All The Provision You Need:

- God Will Provide:
  - Because He Is Your "Never Failing Treasury!"
- And Newton Rightly Applies:
  - All Of These Characteristics:
    - To The Name & Nature:
      - Of Jesus Christ!
  - Because He Is A Sovereign Savior!
    - And You Can Trust In Him!
- \* The Third Note In The Music Of His Name Is That:
- 3. Jesus Is A Sufficient Savior!
  - This Is Something We Find:
    - In 2 Corinthians 12:9 Where Paul Tells Us What Jesus Told Him When He Was Struggling With:
      - Some "Thorn In The Flesh!"
        - Jesus "Said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness!"
    - For Jesus To Be Sufficient:
      - Means That:
        - Jesus Is Enough! And Even:
          - More Than Enough For Your Needs!
  - And So The Name Of Jesus:
    - As Your All-Sufficient Savior:
      - Can & Will Provide:
        - All Of His "Grace To Help In Time Of Need!" (Hebrews 4:16)
    - In The Fourth Verse:
      - Newton Focuses On:
        - The Sufficiency Of Jesus:
          - In Our Functions!
      - Because It Is In Christ:
        - The Beloved One:
          - That You & Your Prayers:
            - Are Accepted By God!
        - "By Thee My Prayers Acceptance Gain!"
          - Which Means That:
            - Even In Your Prayer Life Jesus Is Sufficient & Jesus Is Enough!
      - Also It Is In Christ:
        - As Your Advocate & Mediator With God:
          - That Any & All Accusations:
            - The Devil May Level Against You:
              - Are Empty And Vain!
        - Because Even Though:
          - We Are "With Sin Defiled!"
            - Jesus Is Still Sufficient & Jesus Is Still Enough!
      - Why Because In Christ:
        - You Are Now "Owned A Child!"
          - A Child Of God Himself!
      - Jesus Is Completely Sufficient For You:
        - Even When You Struggle In:
          - Your Functions Before God!
            - "His Grace Is Sufficient For You!"
    - And Then In The Fifth Verse:
      - Newton Focuses On:
        - The Sufficiency Of Jesus:
          - In *His* Functions:
            - Toward Us Who Believe In Him!
      - So That Whatever You Need Jesus To Be:
        - He Already Is And Will Show Himself:
          - To You In These Ways:

- Over & Over Again!
- When You Are Lost:
  - Like A Wandering Sheep:
    - Jesus Can Be Your Shepherd!
- When You Are Lonely:
  - Like A Widowed Spouse:
    - Jesus Can Be Your Husband!
  - There Is Nothing Inappropriate Here:
    - Since He Is The Husband Of His Bride The Church!
- When You Are Longing:
  - For Friendship In The Midst Of:
    - A World Of Hate Jesus Can Be:
      - Your Friend!
- When You Are Learning:
  - About God & Your Faith:
    - You Can Find In Jesus Your True Prophet & Priest & King!
- And When You Are Looking:
  - For Guidance In Your Life:
    - No Matter Where You Are:
      - On Your Journey!
  - Jesus Can Be:
    - Your Lord, Your Life, Your Way, And Your End!
- Because Jesus Is All-Sufficient:
  - For You! Jesus Is:
    - Enough & All You Need!
- And This Great Truth:
  - Caused Newton To Respond:
    - To The Music Of Jesus' Name:
      - With Praise!
        - "Accept The Praise I Bring!"
- But Just Look At The Kind Of Praise:
  - Newton Offers:
    - To Jesus!
  - It's A Humble Praise:
    - Because In The Sixth Verse:
      - Newton Remembers That:
        - Even When He Wants To Praise Jesus The Way He Ought To Be Praised:
          - He Can't!
    - Because The Effort Of His Heart:
      - Is Weak! And:
        - So Is Ours!
    - And He Knows That Even:
      - His Warmest Thought Toward Jesus:
        - Is Cold!
    - But This Too Is How We Ought To Respond:
      - To Jesus As:
        - Our Sympathetic & Sovereign & Sufficient Savior!
      - He Deserves So Much More:
        - Than We Can Bring!
          - But That Doesn't Mean That We Don't Stop Bringing What We Can!
  - Especially When We Praise Him:
    - With A Hopeful Praise!
      - Knowing That There Will Come A Day:
        - As Newton Wrote "But When I See Thee As Thou Art, I'll Praise Thee As I Ought!"
  - And We Will For All Eternity!
    - Because Jesus Is An:

- All-Sufficient Savior!
  - He Is More Than Enough:
    - For Me & For You!
- \* And Then Comes The Fourth & Final Note In The Music Of His Name!
  - And That Is:
- 4. Jesus Is A Satisfying Savior!
  - Which Is Something We Know:
    - From Psalm 103:5 Which Tells Us That The Lord Is The One:
      - "Who satisfieth thy mouth with good [things; so that] thy youth is renewed like the eagle's!"
  - Jesus Is A Satisfying Savior:
    - Who Can Refresh & Renew & Revive You:
      - Like Water:
        - In A Desert!
      - Like Life:
        - In The Midst Of Death!
      - And Like Music:
        - In An Atmosphere:
          - Of Silence!
  - And So Newton Ends His Hymn:
    - With These Words About:
      - Our Satisfying Savior:
        - "Till Then I Would Thy Love Proclaim, With Every Fleeting Breath; And May The Music Of Thy Name, Refresh My Soul In Death!"

## **Conclusion:**

- This Is The Kind Of Savior:
  - We Have In Jesus!
    - He Is Sympathetic!
    - He Is Sovereign!
    - He Is Sufficient!
    - And He Is Satisfying!
  - Just Think About:
    - The Music Of His Name:
      - As We Sing These Truths:
        - Not Only In Praise To Him But Also:
          - To Teach And Admonish One Another:
            - About Him!

- 2. Now Even Though:
  - We Don't Know What Tune:
    - Newton's Congregation Used:
      - To Sing This Hymn For The First Time!
  - The Tune We Will Use:
    - Has Been Associated With Newton's Words:
      - Since 1861!
    - Have The Instruments Play Through It Once:
      - And Then Sing It Together:
        - As We Think About:
          - "The Music Of His Name!"

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
