v11 ~ Personal Closing

- <u>III</u>: "Scribe!" ~ Explain position of scribe in boot camp . . .
 - Drill Instructors didn't type up their own schedules
- People didn't used to pump their own gas
- At this time people didn't write their own letters
 - But they often added a personal note at the end
 - Paul mentions this in 1 Corinthians, Colossians, 2 Thessalonians
 - The personal ending served many purposes
 - 1. Declared it to be an <u>original</u> <u>not a forgery</u>
 - 2. <u>Personalized</u> the epistle
 - 3. <u>Highlighted</u> most important points ~ <u>Galatians</u>

v12 - 13 ~ Judaizers have three stated desires

- 1. "make a good showing"
- 2. "not suffer persecution"
- 3. "boast in subverting Galatians"

Judaizer Goals

- self-aggrandizement ~ <u>look good</u> (desire, showing, desire, boast)
- self-protection ~ <u>feel good</u> (<u>only</u> that they may not suffer ~ fear it)

> How could the circumcision of Galatians accomplish this?

- Let's look at it from several perspectives
 - 1. Jewish and Roman officials
 - 2. Jewish believers / Gentile believers

Jewish and Roman Officials

- Judaism was officially tolerated in Roman provinces
- Everyone knew Jews were circumcised and observed many customs
 - 1. Jews were <u>jealous</u> of the growth of Christianity
 - 2. Jews were dismayed by the popularity of Christ
 - 3. Jews were <u>outraged</u> at the <u>exalted position of Christ</u>
- Christianity still regarded as a sect of Judaism

Jewish believers / Gentile believers

- Jews embraced Christianity and came under attack
- Jews were lynching fellow Jews thought soft on Christianity
- Jewish believers tempted to play down their faith in Christ
- Being Jewish was <u>outward</u> ~ being Christian was <u>inward</u>
- Gentiles were perhaps <u>new to both</u> Judaism and Christianity

Benefits of Aligning with Jews (Syncretism)

- Christians would not be persecuted
- Jews would maintain superiority
- WIN / WIN for Jews and Christians . . .
- <u>III</u>: Computer Lab at National University (*Tracy and D&D*)

> Battle Between Good and Evil is not WIN / WIN

- Jesus said, "the poor you have with you always . . ." (John 12.8)
 - We will never "solve" the problem of the poor
 - The problem springs from our sinful nature
- **1 Cor 1.18** ~ "the message of the cross is foolishness to those who <u>are perishing</u>, but to us who <u>are being saved</u> it is the power of God"
 - Paul stated there are people perishing and being saved
 - Present tense, ongoing, "are perishing", "are being saved"
 - These statements are not theoretical ~ they are real
- III: I-88 West to I-80 West (had to follow I-80 East signs)
 - We were not going east to Chicago ~ but it looked like it . . .
 - Looks can be deceiving ~ We can "look" just like the world . . .
- <u>III 2</u>: Computer Lab (Tracy and car with stickers and Bible stuff)
 - I wanted to blend in ~ I wanted a WIN / WIN
 - But God had something else in mind
 - Read is 55.6-11 ~ "My ways are not your ways"
 - This phrase is in the context of God's work on earth

Xition: We've seen the "way of the world" ~ let's look at "way of the cross"

v14a ~ Our Boast is Only in the Cross

- The Judaizers wanted to boast in accomplishment
 - to exert influence over the young Christians
 - to be accepted by the Jewish religious leaders
 - only wanted to avoid persecution ~ no discomfort or hassles
- Paul, on the other hand, **boasts only** in the cross
 - It doesn't matter if that leads to:
 - acceptance or rejection,
 - praise or ridicule,
 - blessings or beatings
- He no longer boasts of anything unrelated to Christ
 - We may, and often do, boast of many things
 - our accomplishments, our children's accomplishments
 - our knowledge, our skills
 - our children's intelligence, their good conduct
- All pride should begin and end with thanks to God who made us

> v14b ~ Mutual Crucifixion

- "the world has been crucified to me"
 - Nothing in the world can lure Paul away from God
 - <u>fame</u> ~ <u>wealth</u> ~ <u>power</u>
 - Paul likely had all 3 of these to significant degree
 - ♦ Roman citizen from wealthy well-connected family in Tarsus
 - ♦ Probably not even 30 yet when he persecuted Christians
- "I have been crucified to the world"
 - The world cannot get anything from Paul
 - He refuses to be "used" by the world for its purposes
 - Lenin referred to western communist sympathizers as 'useful idiots'
 - He had contempt for them but made use of them
 - Christians are "used" in this way today
 - Christians are often courted by politicians
 - ♦ <u>III</u>: Book, "Tempting Faith" by David Kuo
 - * by statist Christian on Bush's "Faith-based initiative"
 - * National leaders hugged publically but called "nuts" and "goofy"
- Spurgeon ~ "serve men" ~ "bless men" ~ "save men" ~ "don't fear men"

Xition: What is most important in Christ?

> v15 ~ Appearances are Nothing / Miracle of Rebirth is Everything

- "What distinguishes Christians from non-Christians?"
 - Is it our beliefs? ~ The demons believe and tremble
 - Knowing and even believing the truth is not it
 - Is it our actions / our good works? ~ Humanists do likewise
 - What is it? ~ What sets believers apart from unbelievers?
 - It is their relationship with God
- III: Pastor Erber story of sign ~ brought tears to his eyes
 - He was talking with God ~ God kindly gave him the answer
 - He was in his car tearing up, talking with God
 - <u>III</u>: On I-80 in cars (same way diff dests) ~ living miraculously
- "Are you talking with God?"
 - If you're <u>not</u>, then your <u>not</u> distinguishable from unbelievers
 - Not in the way that counts . . .
- It is the miraculous that separates believers from unbelievers
 - The miracle of rebirth
 - And it is communion with God that marks the miraculous life
 - Without communion with God our light our salt diminishes

> v12, v16 ~ "As many as . . .

- v12 ~ "As many as desire to make a good showing . . ."
- v16 ~ "As many as walk according to this rule . . ."
- Two paths contrasted
 - The Way of the World ~ "desire, experience, materialism"
 - The Way of the Cross ~ "sacrifice, faith, miraculous"

> v16b ~ "walk" – "peace and mercy .. upon .. the Israel of God"

- Those who walk in obedience ~ practicing mutual crucifixion
- These are the "Israel of God"
- Only these does Paul bless

> v17 ~ Scarred for Christ

- "stigmata" ~ Paul not speaking of miraculous appearance of scars
 - Paul's scars were not obtained miraculously
 - The wounds were made by those that rejected the miraculous
 - "marks of the Lord Jesus"
 - Jesus didn't apply them ~ but they mark Paul as His . . .

> v18a ~ "Brethren"

- Paul began this letter with a strong rebuke
- But he ends it with an appeal to brothers
- We can learn from Paul's example
 - We can discuss divisive matters yet part as friends
 - We can discipline our children yet hug them and tuck them in
 - We can confront someone c/a slight yet not sever the relationship
 - We can model ourselves after Christ and forgive as he forgave

v18b ~ "Grace ... be with your spirit"

- Paul again reminds them of the miraculous
- He could have said, "God be with you . . ."
- But he said "be with your spirit . . ."
 - God wants us to <u>live</u> spiritually, to <u>walk</u> spiritually
 - Walking with Him ~ Talking to Him

> Talking with God

- III: Train ride into Chicago on Metra
 - Great conversation ~ "just war", "freezing human heads"
- Favorite verse **Gen 5.24** "Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him."
 - God will one day <u>take</u> all of us . . .
 - But will He take us to <u>continue</u> a conversation we're having with Him here on earth?
 - Or will we have to start one anew with Him when we leave this earth?
- > Live Miraculously!
- > Talk to God every day!
- That's the first discipline on the Way of the Cross!
- Let us pray . . .
