Today, I want us to take a few minutes to look at these **three additional verses of Silent Night**, and let's consider the message they present. They remind us of the message of Christmas, which is to say that they remind us of the message of the gospel.

To enjoy peace is to be in harmony with God and self and others and things.

Silent Night, Holy Night

Originally there were 6 stanzas to "Silent Night, Holy Night". Following are these 6 stanzas, based on the familiar English translation, but yet faithful to the original.

Stanza 4 celebrates freedom and peace. The year "Silent Night" was written, was the end of the Napoleonic Wars. Salzburg was the last state to be liberated and Mohr knew of the oppression and this stanza could reflect that.

Stanza 5 reveals Mohr's progressive attitude. At that time, pre-Christian rituals were still in existance in that area. This verse suggests that Mohr believed in redemption from God, without a priest as intermediary.
