Sermon Outline for Sunday, December 5, 2021

Sermon: "Destroyed By Lust" Pt. 2- What's Wrong With You People? Pt. 33

I Text:

Old Covenant: *Judges 10:10-16*

New Covenant: *James 1:13-25*

II Doctrine:

Israel is reaping the fruit of judgment because of their perverted behavior as a Nation. They take the first step towards redemption by admitting their guilt before God. They stop teaching their people God's law and commands are evil. The Church in America must do the same!

Whether it is an individual or Nation, confession of your sin is not enough, only the first step! Even though the Nation confessed their sins, God did not immediately deliver them. He reminded them of their spiritual immaturity and constant backsliding. God told them to ask the perverted God's they worshipped for forgiveness.

Talk is cheap when worshipping the living God! Our Lord wants repentance followed by real action. God only agrees to deliver Israel when he sees true repentance through their actions. We are calling God the Holy Spirit powerless, when we claim he cannot change our sinful ways and lead us to true repentance.

III Comparing Scripture With Scripture:

1) Israel is reaping the fruit of judgment because of their perverted behavior as a Nation. They take the first step towards redemption by admitting their guilt before God. They stop teaching their people God's law and commands are evil. The Church in America must do the same! (*Judges 10:10; James 1:13-18*)

2) Whether it is an individual or Nation, confession of your sin is not enough, only the first step! Even though the Nation confessed their sins, God did not immediately deliver them. He reminded them of their spiritual immaturity and constant backsliding. God told them to ask the perverted God's they worshipped for forgiveness. (*Judges 10:11-14; James 1:19-21*)

3) Talk is cheap when worshipping the living God! Our Lord wants repentance followed by real action. God only agrees to deliver Israel when he sees true repentance through their actions. We are calling God the Holy Spirit powerless, when we claim he cannot change our sinful ways and lead us to true repentance. (*Judges 10:15,16; James 1:22-25*)
