- c. Ministry Priority #3: "Don't confuse temptation with sin."
 - i. The Bible definitely teaches it is possible to be tempted without sinning (James 1:13-15; 1 Cor. 10:13; Hebrews 4:15).
 - ii. Temptations may arise from within (the flesh), from the world (situations, circumstances, particular allurements), or from the devil.
 - iii. Sin occurs not simply at the level of outward actions but inward thoughts and intentions (Matthew 5:27-28).
 - iv. No desire is neutral, per se.
 - v. It's appropriate to seek change at the level of our desires, affections, and motivations.

Galatians 5:24 And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Colossians 3:5 Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry.

"Practical guidelines for facing temptation"

- Literally turn away
- Call out to God in prayer
- Get angry at Satan
- Consider what good work God is calling you to do right now
- Pray for the person you're attracted to if you're often around them
- Ask, "Am I fighting this desire or fueling it?"

d. Ministry Priority #4: Have realistic, biblical expectations for change

e. Ministry Priority #5: Create a context for both singles and married couples to thrive in your church

"Holy sexuality consists of two paths: chastity in singleness and faithfulness in marriage. Chastity is more than simply abstention from extramarital sex; it conveys purity and holiness. Faithfulness is more than merely maintaining chastity and avoiding illicit sex; it conveys covenantal commitment." (*Holy Sexuality*, 47)
