2 Cor 11:2,3 DIVINE JEALOUSY, DIVINE BOASTING

PRELIMS. I want to speak on Divine Jealousy, Divine Boasting and then something about the true credentials!

DIVINE JEALOUSY

When we think of jealousy we usually think of a husband being jealous of his 'flirting' wife! Is this jealousy **wrong**? **No!** If he is not jealous about how his wife behaves towards other men then that reflects on his **commitment/love** to his wife! God is **often** jealous about His people "you shall worship no other god for the LORD whose name is **Jealous**, <u>is a jealous</u> God" [Ex34]

Now jealous and **zealous** are the same word! They are interchangeable! Jealousy is actually a **good** thing! We **ought** to be jealous at times. Paul's jealousy was a **good** jealousy! It was the jealousy that God has for His people "I feel a divine jealousy for you"[1]! **Elijah** did all the excellent things he did because "I have been very jealous for the Lord"[1Kin 19:10]

It is **because** a husband **loves** his wife that he is jealous when she throws her affections around to other men. God is jealous about His people **because** He **loves** them – not because He hates them. It is because God **knows** what will happen to them if they **continue** to be unfaithful – they will get **hurt!**

Many people think God's commandments are a **kill-joy** – but they are not at all meant to spoil our fun but to **protect** us from what God knows **will happen** – and He does **not want** us to get **hurt**! Thus Paul "...But I am afraid that as the serpent deceived Eve..." and she was **hurt**, so you may get hurt too![3] Jealousy is **distinct** from **envy** – which **desires** the offender to get **hurt**! Envy is **wishing** the person who makes you jealous to get hurt – but **God's** jealousy desires us to **avoid** getting hurt!

Paul was **concerned** here (jealous) of the Cors because he saw they were being "*deceived*" by the serpent's cunning, and

"your thoughts will be **led astray** from a sincere and <u>pure</u> devotion to Christ"[3]! He was concerned they would end up in grief. He loved them and **saw them heading** straight for disaster. So he sent them this warning.

<u>APP</u> Paul love for the Cors is a great **challenge** for us! Do **you** see any of **ourselves** as a congregation heading for disaster? And if so, do we have a **godly jealousy** for them? Are we "afraid" they will come to grief, as Paul was for the Cors? Are we seeing any of us heading away from the Lord? Becoming **slack** in our **attendance** at services? No spirituality in our prayers? Is our loose **language** a sign of something deeper? Are we concerned about **backsliding** amongst us? Or are we just **'allowing'** any slack behaviour to continue? You know the natural course for backsliding is to backslide **further**!!

Paul was concerned about the **doctrine** the Cors were believing from the false prophets. But we can backslide in **other ways** also. In fact one of **Satan's tricks** is to deceive us into thinking that as long as a person still goes to church, everything is fine. But No! It is not just doctrine but **attitude/spirit** that characterizes backsliding. Paul says in [4] "if you receive a **different spirit** from the one you received" at the beginning (from me), then you have been led astray!

That means that if you have another **attitude** from the attitude of Christ then you have been led astray! Paul says "we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God," [1Cor 2:12]. There is a "spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience" [Eph2:2] APP If you are angry when you ought not to be; when you say things you ought not to say; when you are bitter/revengeful/short-tempered/irritable/miscalling/complaining then we have been led astray from the Lord! *When we see one another having that "spirit of the world" in their language, do we have a godly jealousy? Do we pray for grace to say the right thing? Pray for them?

GODLY BOASTING

Sol says "Answer a fool according to his folly lest he will be wise in his own eyes" [Pro 26:5]! That is what Paul is doing here "I wish you would bear with me in a little foolishness" [1,17,21b]! 'I hate this boasting, but it seems to be the only language you understand'! *"Since many boast according to the flesh, I too will boast" [18]! But he does it reluctantly! When Paul says he is boasting, he is really just being honest! He is telling the truth, exactly like it is! He is not exaggerating or 'blowing his own trumpet', he is not being proud!

The false prophets **looked-down** on Paul, so he felt he had to **defend** himself. **First**, they said he was not worth listening to because he did **not charge** for his services! One of the signs of success in Greece was the **fee** you could charge. They believed the **myth** 'If it was dear, then it was good'! Many people today believe that! Paul did **not charge** anything for preaching! "did I commit a sin in humbling myself so that you might be exalted, because I preached God's gospel to you free of charge?"[7] Paul did not want to be a **burden** on his congregations "when I was with you and was in need, I did not burden anyone, for the brothers who came from Macedonia supplied my need. So I refrained and will refrain from burdening you in any way"[9].

The **second** reason they looked-down on Paul was because he **turned upside-down** the **glamorous image** of Greek **heroism!** [Read Clements p214] Alexander the Great, conquered cities by scaling over city walls and capturing enemies and returning in triumphant processions. Paul did the **opposite** – he had to **escape** from **persecution** by climbing over walls "At Damascus, the governor under King Aretas was guarding the city of Damascus in order to seize me, but I was let down in a **basket** through a window in the wall and escaped his hands" [32,33]! Paul climbed walls to **escape capture!** *So, Paul felt he had to explain some **facts** of his ministry.

There <u>is</u> a place and a time when we have to tell the truth, for the truth's sake! Listen to Paul [5] "I consider that I am <u>not</u> in the least inferior to these super-apostles. Even if I am unskilled in speaking, I am <u>not so in knowledge</u>"!! Extraordinary having just said "it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends" [10:18].

The Psalmist speaks of his **innocence** (when he has to)! "The Lord dealt with me according to my righteousness, according to the cleanness of my hands He has rewarded me + "I was blameless before him, and I kept myself from my guilt" [Psa 18:20,23] + David = "Vindicate me, O Lord for I have walked in my integrity...I wash my hands in innocence" [Psa 26:1,3]. APP Some Xns believe we can never please God and we can never do right! We are constantly great sinners and can do nothing acceptably to God! Not true! There is Godly boasting! Man can give glory to God on earth!

GODLY CREDENTIALS

So what **did** Paul boast about? "If I must boast, I will boast of the things that show my weakness "[30]!! Not his achievements (of which he had many)! Rather of the many things he suffered and **endured** for Christ! When you apply for a job, you have to give your CV! You record all the great things you have done and the excellent courses you have passed. Paul did the **opposite!** Paul's real credentials were what he **suffered** for Christ. "[I had] "far more imprisonments with countless beatings, and often near death...forty lashes less one...three times I was beaten with rods. Once I was stoned ... three times I was shipwrecked...many a sleepless night, in hunger and thirst...in cold and exposure "[23-29]! All this because he believed in Jesus Christ! Moses "choosing rather to suffer affliction"+disciples "rejoicing because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name" What a challenge! We must not **deliberately** choose suffering – but **if called**....
