Bible clarity on the believer's highest loyalty

- 1. What can believers expect from religious and secular authorities? (v.13-18)
 - a. Believers that speak about the gospel should expect <u>critical</u> <u>examination</u> (v.13-14).
 - i. The Holy Spirit gives witnesses **unusual confidence** (V.13).
 - ii. The Holy Spirit changes people **<u>beyond explanation</u>** (V14).
 - b. Believers that speak up about Jesus should expect efforts to **<u>silence</u>** their message (v.15-18).
- 2. How should believers react when told to disobey God? (v.19-22)
 - a. Obedience to civil authorities is a <u>scriptural imperative</u>. Rom 13; Titus 3:1-2; 1 Pet 2:13-25
 - b. Obedience to God is the **prime directive** (v.19).
 - i. Christians make decisions based on what is right not on what is **popular**, **politically correct** or even legal.
 - ii. Christians make decisions based on what they know <u>to be</u> <u>true</u> (v.20).
 - c. God is always the **<u>highest authority</u>** (v.21-22).
- 3. <u>Who is the believer's resource when suffering wrong for doing right?</u> (v.23-31)
 - a. We should seek **<u>other believers</u>** in the trial of our faith (v.23).
 - b. We should join together in prayer to seek God in the trials of our faith (v.24-28)
 - c. We should ask for <u>bold confidence</u> in the trials of our life (v.29-30).
 - d. We should expect an answer to the prayer for boldness because God **<u>delights in it</u>** (v.31).
