Background to Psalm 16

- David wrote this.
- It's called a *Mikhtam* (according to Job 19.23-24 this refers to something written on stone in order to be preserved!)
 √ if Psalm 14 was the ungodliness of all mankind
 - ✓ if Psalm 15 is the character of the redeemed worshiper
 - √ then Psalm 16 is the life of the worshiper with future hope

THESIS — Ps 16 tells us to be *happy*/joyful in God. How do you *live in the NOW* while hoping for *the THEN*.

I. LOOK ABOVE (1-2)

• the point: find refuge in God.

II. LOOK AROUND (3-4)

• the point: love the saints!

v.4 is a clear verbal echo back to Genesis 3:16 - the story of the Fall - spoken to Eve.

vv.3-4 - the ritual of pouring and drinking of sacrifice blood — David says he will not *lift/take up* the names of the pagan gods. The picture here is of the pagan worshiper lifting up the libation (sacrificial) cup to his lips to drink the sacrificial blood — here identified with the names of the pagan gods ALL in allegiance and commitment to them. (Gerald Wilson)

III. LOOK WITHIN (5-8)

• the point: counsel your heart.

Psalm 16 — "Joyful Living Now While Hoping in the Future Bliss To Come"

Where do we get this counsel? v.7

- Thru Scripture
- Thru the Spirit
- Thru Wise Christians
- Thru Prayer
- Thru Worship/Preaching

IV. <u>LOOK AHEAD</u> (9-11)

- the point: Christ's Resurrection! future bliss!
- A. v.9—the rejoicing in my Messiah
- B. v.10—the resurrection of my Messiah
- C. v.11—the rest with my Messiah

Note the pilgrimage of the future

- 1. the GUIDE You (God)
- 2. the TRAVELLER (me)
- 3. the WAY (the path)
- 4. the END (of Life)
