- D. Possible interpretations
  - i. David is just wrong: he is pretty much as bad as anyone, and worse than some.
  - ii. David is counting on God having a low standard for righteousness.
  - iii. David is claiming to be righteous by virtue of his bond with God.
  - iv. David is claiming righteousness in a certain situation or relationship not in all of his life.
