This Sunday, we begin a new series of messages under the heading: "How to Build the Perfect Church." By perfect church, we mean what the Scriptures mean in passages like Ephesians 4:11-16, which I've pasted below for you to read and think about. Perfect in Ephesians 4:13-16 means, mature, complete, properly grown up as a body in proportion to Christ who is our head, lacking in no good gift or act of service to build the church up in love.

I will seek to make use of the Bible's own big picture theologies for the life and growth of our church: covenant theology, biblical theology, and systematic theology. We're beginning with the last picture of the church on the last page of the Bible to inform and outfit Grace Baptist for greater mutual communion, faithfulness, obedience, service, and witness.

I encourage you to read Revelation 21 and 22 in preparation for worship, and in particular Revelation 22:12-17 and Psalm 87:2-3 which gives greater prominence, power, and fruitfulness to the corporate life, worship, service, and witness of the church than the individual believer. Revelation 22:12-15 is clear on the happiness of the reward of the individual believer's obedience, but the closing exhortation for a faithful witness of the gospel of Christ is given to the church.
