I. **Judge Not – 7:1-5**

A. Initial Observations

B. Matters of Judgment

- Not by outward appearance John 7:24
 "Do not judge according to appearance, but judge with righteous judgment."
- 2. Do not judge matters of opinion (adiaphora) -- the Doctrine of Christian Liberty.
- 3. Do not judge without sufficient knowledge.
- 4. Do not think that you stand in the place of God.
- 5. All judgment has been given to Jesus Christ. John 5:22

C. The Qualifying Immediate Context 7:1-5

- 1. The Motivation Behind the Command v. 1
- 2. The Warning Behind the Command v. 2
- 3. Hypocrites v. 3-5
- 4. Eye Surgery v. 5

Take care of the "I" before attempting "eye" surgery!

Gal. 6:1 – "Brethren, if any man be overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.

II. Be Discerning 7:6

This takes judgment!

Gill quotes a Jewish saying (date and origin uncertain)

"Do not cast pearls before swine, nor deliver wisdom to him, who knows not the excellency of it: for wisdom is better than pearls, and he that does not seek after it, is worse than a swine."

A. In Gospel Witness

Do not be surprised that the gospel offends because:

- 1. Natural man does not believe he is a sinner.
- 2. If a natural man does believe he is a sinner, he naturally wants to be the author of his own salvation by good works/religious activities.

B. In Missionary Endeavors

C. The Context is Reproving and Rebuking

Proverbs 9:7, 8

There are literally a dozen such Proverbs in this book of wisdom.

Proverbs 26:4, 5

This is not a contradiction – this is wisdom.

III. Ask, Seek, Find 7:7-12

- A. We Learn about our Father v. 11
- B. We Learn about our Responsibility to our Neighbor v. 12
- C. We Learn about our Responsibility to Pray 7-10

Ask, Seek Find -- all three verbs are in the present-active-imperative

It's a command. (imperative)

It's something we must do (active)

It something to do continually – keep on doing – (Gk present tense)
