BLESSED PEACE

Ephesians 2:11-22 — Pastor Nick Thompson

I. We once were alienated from God and His people (vv. II-I2).

A. We were strangers to God's covenant.

B. We were strangers to God's salvation.

II. We now are reconciled to God and His people (vv. 13-22).

A. We are brought near through Christ's cross (vv. 13-16).

B. We are brought near through Christ's word (v. 17).

C. We are brought near through Christ's Spirit (vv. 18-22).

QUESTIONS FOR FAMILY WORSHIP

- I. Why does Paul begin v. I I with the word "Therefore"? What does this teach us about the relationship between salvation and the church?
- 2. What are we commanded to remember here? Why is it important for us to remember our spiritual past?
- 3. How did Christ's death purchase peace? Is this peace between God and sinners or between sinner and sinner?
- 4. What images does Paul use in vv. 19-22 to speak of the church's unity/oneness?
- 5. How does division among Christians contradict the gospel?

QUESTIONS FOR PRIVATE REFLECTION

- Do I regularly reflect on my former life in sin? Or am I forgetful of what God delivered me from?
- 2. Is the gospel working itself out in my life in peaceful, loving relationships with other believers?
- 3. Are there any relationship(s) I have with fellow-Christians that contradict the peace of the gospel? Why is this so devastating?
