Praxis

- 1. If all Scripture is profitable for us to hear (2 Tim 3:16-17), how would Isa 34 have profitably benefitted Isaiah's original hearers? How might it positively benefit us to think of God ominous presence & warnings? (i.e., what might be some results of you meditating deeply on Isaiah 34)?
- 2. Isaiah refers to Israel as "ransomed / redeemed" (35:9-10), terms we use for ourselves as Christians... how does embracing the full meaning of these terms promote our worship, our fellowship?
- 3. Thought Question: Believing disciples of Jesus are metaphorically already on the "Holy Highway" to Zion, and yet our way is often fraught with difficulty that makes us tend toward "weak hands / feeble knees"... So, if 35:10 says those on the Holy Highway are singing with joy, what perspective(s) allows us to have such joy? What will tend to mute our joy?
