God's Wrath and the Church Ezekiel 24:1-27

Main Point:

Put your confidence in Christ (not your church membership) and take your sin seriously so that you are spared from God's wrath.

1. Those in the church are not automatically protected from God's wrath.

2. Those in the church who refuse to repent and be corrected are especially liable to God's wrath.

3. Those in the church who put their confidence in Jesus Christ are mercifully spared from God's wrath.

2 Kings 25:1-2 1 Now it came to pass in the ninth year of his reign, in the tenth month, on the tenth *day* of the month, *that* Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon and all his army came against Jerusalem and encamped against it; and they built a siege wall against it all around. 2 So the city was besieged until the eleventh year of King Zedekiah. (NKJV)

Ezekiel 11:2-3 2 And He said to me: "Son of man, these *are* the men who devise iniquity and give wicked counsel in this city, 3 who say, "*The time is* not near to build houses; this *city is* the caldron, and we *are* the meat.' (NKJV)
