## **ELIJAH IS TAKEN TO HEAVEN**

2 Kings 2:1-18

## I. <u>TESTING ELISHA'S DEVOTION</u> (vs. 1-6)

- **A. Stay here.** (vs. 2, 4, 6)
  - 1. Elijah visits the schools of prophets before departing.

(Dan 11:32-33; 2 Tim 2:2)—passing faith to the next generation

- a. <u>Samaria</u>—the capital city of a wicked king
- **b. Bethel**—stronghold of apostasy (Jeroboam's golden calf)
- c. Jericho—city recently rebuilt in defiance of God
- 2. Elijah intends to go out quietly. (humility)
- 3. Elisha refuses to leave Elijah's side. (proves his devotion)
- B. I know, I know!
  - **1. Sons of the Prophets**—spiritual, prophets in training
  - 2. God intends others to witness Elijah's departure
    - a. To strengthen their faith
    - b. To value their calling
- C. Don't speak of it. It hurts too much to talk about it.
- II. CONFIRMING ELISHA'S CALL (v. 7-10, 13-15)
  - A. <u>His Last Request</u> (v. 9)—spiritual power to continue Elijah's ministry
    - **1. A "Double Portion"** (Deut 21:17; 1 Kings 19:16, 19)—desires the inheritance of the oldest son, to succeed Elijah in ministry
    - **2.** <u>Elijah's Spirit</u> (Acts 1:4-5, 8)— the spiritual power to fulfill his calling to do what Elijah has been doing
    - **3. Foreshadowing of Pentecost** (Num 11:29; Mat 3:11; Acts 1:8)
      - a. Need Spirit of Jesus to fulfill our calling, continue His ministry
      - b. Only Jesus can give the Holy Spirit!
  - **B.** Taking up the Mantle (v. 13; 1 King 19:19)— Elisha accepts and embraces his calling; takes the outward symbol of his office

- C. Parting the Waters (v. 8)—the LORD verifies Elisha's calling
  - **1. Moses and Joshua** (Ex 14:21-22; Josh 3:7, 14-17)— Red Sea and Jordan
  - 2. Elijah and Elisha (vs. 8, 14)—both part the Jordan River
- D. Recognized as Elijah's Successor—the other prophets bow before him
- III. THE DEPARTURE OF ELIJAH (vs. 11-12, 15-18)
  - A. <u>A Whirlwind</u> (Ps 104:3-4)—physical manifestation of God's presence
  - **B.** The Chariots and Horses of Fire (2 King 6:17; 13:14)—vision of angelic escort
    - **1. We are involved in a spiritual** <u>battle</u>. (a *battle* chariot)
    - 2. God's angels are usually unseen but very <u>real and present</u>.
    - 3. <u>Heaven</u> is waiting to receive the servants of God.
  - C. The Case of the Missing Body (vs. 16-18)
    - 1. Similar Cases
      - **a. Enoch** (Gen 5:24)—never died; translated directly to Heaven
      - **b.** Moses (Deut 34:5-6; Rom 6:23 & 7:13)—died but body was *never* found because God buried him
      - **c.** Elijah—never died; ascended to heaven in his earthly body; changed
      - **d. Jesus** (Lk 24:51; Acts 1:9)—died and resurrected, ascends glorified
        - <u>Died</u> like Moses, not for His own sins but for ours
        - Ascended like Elijah, but in His resurrected, glorified body
        - Accomplished <u>complete victory</u> over sin and death
    - **2.** The Return of Elijah before the Messiah (Mal 3:23-24; Mat 11:10-11)
    - **3. The Return of Christ at the Resurrection** (1 Cor 15:51-52; 1 Thes 4:15-17)
      - a. Elijah's ascension is a *prophetic illustration* of what Christ would accomplish.
      - b. When Christ returns, we will ascend and we will be glorified!
