She is Loved by Another (a Lover, Friend, Husband?) b. She commits adultery → NET Bible—"even though she loves another man and continually commits adultery" → NOTE: This command was for Hosea and his wife, Gomer! B. Powerful Picture—3:1b-c 1. Hosea was to love **AS** the Lord loved Israel a. God's love is unconditional b. God's love is unstoppable 2. Israel turned to other gods ➔ QUOTE: Jeremiah 3:20 3. Israel participated in celebrations to false gods with raisin cakes a. The cakes were part of the pagan idolatry b. The cakes may have been thought to arouse sensual desire
