Romans 7:1-6

Matthew 6:24 -- No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one, and love the other; or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon.

I. The Marriage Analogy The Lost Man and the Law v. 1-6

The Marriage Analogy – An analogy is the logical connection between things

- A. Conflicting views of this Chapter
 - 1. Some believe that Paul is writing about his experiences only as a lost man and not about sanctification in his Christian life. We disagree.
 - 2. We need to understand the word "Law" as used by Paul in this chapter.
 - 1) The Moral Law of God the 10 Commandments v. 1, 22
 - 2) In regard to civil law marriage as the example v. 2, 3
 - 3) The law as a governing principle a power or even a habit v. 21, 22
- B. The Lost Man and the Law v. 1-3

Revelation 20:12 -- ¹² And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, **and books were opened**. Then another book was opened, which is the book of life. And the dead were judged by what was written in the books, **according to what they had done.**

In our lost state – we were under law -- we were married to the law

II. The Christian is Free from the Law -v. 4-6

The husband (the law) dies – and the wife is free to remarry! We are free to be in Christ and become part of the Bride of Christ!

- A. Free in Christ to live and bear good fruit **v.4**
- B. What does "dead to the law" mean? The curse is gone! -- Galatians 3:10-14
- C. We once lived under the law -- v. 5
 We were "in the flesh" (flesh as sinful nature not flesh and blood) before Christ saved us.
- D. Our heart that has been changed -- v. 6b
- E. A summary of the analogy (How the Lord uses the Law)
