- B. The Branch/Jesus will
 - 1. Be beautiful and glorious
 - 2. Shall be the pride and honor of the remnant
 - 3. Shall wash away their filth (the LORD, through the Branch)
 - 4. Shall cover the "whole site of Mount Zion" with a "cloud by day and pillar of fire by night"
 - 5. Shall be a canopy and a resting place (Jesus as covering and true Sabbath)
- V. Final Thoughts
 - A. The mountain will be established for the glory of God and the proclamation of His truth to all nations
 - B. The mountain must be established because the people of God continue in rebellion, idolatry, unbelief, and pride.
 - C. God Himself will break the cycle of creation, fall, and judgment with an unbreakable cycle of creation, fall, and redemption for a remnant from among His people.
 - D. Final redemption will be established for "the Mountain" by the exaltation of "the Branch"
 - E. A final "in that day" is coming in which judgment and redemption will reach their conclusion
 - 1. Those "recorded for life in Jerusalem" will receive salvation
 - 2. Those who remain in their wickedness will receive a just judgment
