Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's sermon. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions will help to drive home the point of today's study. It is also helpful when you are able to discuss your answers with others.

- 1. Read Jeremiah 10:5-12 and Romans 1:18-32. It may be easy today to see the folly of trusting in the physical idols of the Ancient Near East, but how does Romans demonstrate the enduring popularity of idolatrous realities?
- 2. Read **Malachi 1:6-10** and **Mark 11:15-18**. How can people who say they worship and serve the true God of the Bible still be guilty of a kind of idolatry? How can you prevent this sort of lapse in your life?
- 3. Read **1 John 5:21**. Review the five subpoints from the sermon's second point. Which of these is the biggest temptation for you? What specific part of your weekly world is exposing and coaxing you to think like that?
- 4. Read **1 Corinthians 1:18-25**. How can this passage strengthen you to think rightly about God and not capitulate to the cultural assault upon biblical truth?
- 5. Read **Jeremiah 6:16-17** and **1 Timothy 6:20-21**. How can you increase your tenacity to hang on tightly to the historic and unchanging truth of God's word and not be swept along by an ever-changing set of cultural values?
