Main Point:

Instead of trying to be someone else, embrace the identity you've been given through union with Christ.

1. Your identity is rooted in your union with Christ.

2. Being united to Christ, He is your representative.

3. Being united to Christ, He lives in you by His Spirit.

4. Embrace the identity you've been given through union with Christ.
