Sunday, January 5, 2020 God is My Salvation – Isaiah 61. Israel's Hope – Isa. 50:1-11

Has the Lord forsaken and forgotten His people? (Isaiah 49:14) No! When He comes to them He finds them unresponsive with their relationship in need of repair, though seemingly permanently terminated.

- I. The Unresponsive Sinners vs. 1-3
 - A. Irreparable?
 - 1. Divorce has the relationship been rendered dissolved?
 - 2. No certificate means it has not been finalized Deut. 24:1-4
 - B. Unredeemable?
 - 1. Sold to pay the debt the slave market Exodus 21:7; Neh. 5:1-5
 - 2. Can the debt be paid? Hos. 3:1-5
 - C. No Remedy for Rebellion?
 - 1. You've done this to yourselves
 - 2. See Judges 2:14; 3:8-9; 4:2; 10:7
 - D. Why Was There No One to Answer? Isa. 5:4
 - 1. I Came, I Called Gen. 3:8
 - 2. No man answered (but the Servant will answer)
 - 3. Ransom Psa. 111:9; 130:7
 - 4. Power effortless sovereignty
 - a. Indeed Behold, See
 - b. The Lord is able to do what He promises just look at His works in Creation and His power over it
 - 1) Dry up the waters Exodus 14:13-14, 21-22
 - 2) Strike the water, turning it to blood Exodus 7:17-18
 - 3) Turn the light of day to darkness Exodus 10:21, 23
 - 5. Their failure to respond leaves them without excuse
- II. The Responsive Servant vs. 4-6
 - A. Israel Does not Hear, but the Servant Hears and Speaks John 14:10, 24
 - B. Israel Turned Away, but the Servant Obeys at Cost Phil. 2:8; Heb. 12:1-2; Matt. 27:27-31; Luke 18:31-33
- III. The Sovereign Lord Helps vs. 7-9
 - A. The Lord will Help Me
 - 1. I Will Not Be Disgraced (uncertainty of outcome, end in confusion)
 - 2. I Am Determined
 - 3. I Will Not Be Put to Shame
 - B. Justified declared to be right/innocent

- 1. No truth to charges or accusations
- 2. Innocent, without stain
- 3. The One who accounts Me righteous will bring a verdict of innocence the Lord is on My side Rom. 8:31-39
- C. The Sovereign Lord Helps My enemies will be worn out and helpless Psa. 39:11-12; Isa. 51:6
- IV. The Submissive and the Self-Sufficient vs. 10-11
 - A. Those Who Follow the Servant
 - 1. Fear the Lord
 - 2. Obey the Servant
 - 3. Walks in darkness, but by faith when we walk with Him and follow Him we will be hated like Him Luke 9:35; Exodus 20:18-21; Psa. 23:4; John 15:18-25
 - B. Those Who Are Self-Sufficient
 - 1. Walk in self-kindled light (self-enlightenment)
 - 2. Surrounded by their own insight
 - 3. Will lie down in torment going your own way, dealing with darkness with a DIY attitude, leads only to doom Rev. 3:17-18
