WE APPROACH THE LORD

Call to Worship

As conquerors in Christ, we are called to praise the King and proclaim all the ways (past, present, and future) in which he rules in righteousness.

Revelation 15:3-4 ESV

³ And they sing the song of Moses, the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying,

"Great and amazing are your deeds,

O Lord God the Almighty!

Just and true are your ways,

O King of the nations!

⁴ Who will not fear, O Lord, and glorify your name?

For you alone are holy.

All nations will come and worship you,

for your righteous acts have been revealed."

* Reading from the Law

All of Scripture points toward Christ. In this passage, Moses prophecies a future king and lays out a set of rules for all future kings. The King was not only supposed to lead Israel in battle and defeat her enemies, but he was also to rule in righteousness according to the law so that Israel would follow in righteousness. Solomon failed deeply according to these laws, but there is a better Solomon.

Deuteronomy 17:14-20 ESV

"When you come to the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you possess it and dwell in it and then say, I will set a king over me, like all the nations that are around me, 15 you may indeed set a king over you whom the LORD your God will choose. One from among your brothers you shall set as king over you. You may not put a foreigner over you, who is not your brother. ¹⁶ Only he must not acquire many horses for himself or cause the people to return to Egypt in order to acquire many horses, since the LORD has said to you, 'You shall never return that way again.' 17 And he shall not acquire many wives for himself, lest his heart turn away, nor shall he acquire for himself excessive silver and gold. ¹⁸ "And when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, he shall write for himself in a book a copy of this law, approved by the Levitical priests. 19 And it shall be with him, and he shall read in it all the days of his life, that he may learn to fear the LORD his God by keeping all the words of this law and these statutes, and doing them, 20 that his heart may not be lifted up above his brothers, and that he may not turn aside from the commandment, either to the right hand or to the left, so that he may continue long in his kingdom, he and his children, in Israel."

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

The accuser has been defeated because Christ took on our sin and imputed to us his righteousness. This means the accuser has no argument against us. Our king has defeated all enemies!

Revelation 12:10 ESV

And I heard a loud voice in heaven, saying, "Now the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God and the authority of his Christ have come, for the accuser of our brothers has been thrown down, who accuses them day and night before our God.
