The Search for Fulfillment
An Introduction to Ecclesiastes
Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:18-25

Bethany Baptist Church January 6, 2019 (p.m.) October 23, 2011 (a.m.) The **OT book of** *Ecclesiastes* 'opening statement (**1:1**) reads like the *title page* of a book. It spotlights Ecclesiastes' *author* & his *credentials*:

The words of the Preacher, the son of David, king in Jerusalem.

You know who *that* is, *right*? ... **Solomon** – *King* Solomon. *David's* son (by *Bathsheba*). United Israel's *third king*. And, Solomon titles himself *the Preacher* – the speaker of *great words* to *great assemblies*.

What do you remember about *King Solomon*?

- Solomon, like his father, *ruled over Israel* for **40** years. **Forty** years of political & economic *peace* & *prosperity*.
- Solomon was incredibly *wise*! David knew his son was wise from an *early age*, but then God answered Solomon's prayer & gave him *even more* wisdom. Solomon wrote *books* of wisdom. People came from all over to *hear* his wisdom.
- Do you recall the account of Solomon's *incredible insight* into the human heart (**1 Kg 3**): two *harlots*, two *babies*? One infant dies, *smothered* under his *sleeping* mother, & she then *steals* the other. *Those 2 women go to war!* They bring their story to the king. (Now, this is before the days of **DNA** testing.) Wise King Solomon has an *equitable* solution: "Bring me a sword." "Divide the living child in two, & give half to one, & half to the other!"
  - Says **one woman**, filled w/ compassion, "Give the first woman the living child, & by no means kill him."
  - o Says the **other**, "Let him be neither mine nor yours, but divide him!"
  - Says **Solomon**, "Give the **first** woman the living child..." We get it!
  - o **1Kg 3:28 -** And all Israel heard of the judgment...and they feared the king, for they saw the wisdom of God was in him..."
- Despite his blessings & his wisdom, Solomon spiraled into a disturbing spiritual decline! O, he started off well enough. He built the Temple in Jerusalem, realizing the dream of his father David. And his fabulous wisdom was a gift of God, because Solomon wanted to rule God's people well.

- But *then* Solomon took an interest in things that God had *warned* against since the days of Moses: *horses*, *chariots*, & *foreign wives*. *Many* wives. *Seven hundred* wives & *three hundred* concubines!
  - o **1 Kings 11**: His wives turned his heart after other gods; and his heart was **not** loyal to the Lord his God, as was the heart of his father David.
  - o Fancy wheels & foreign women talk about a mid-life crisis!

Sum them up! Wisdom, wealth, & wandering. These **three** things add up to this: King Solomon, no doubt sad & scarred as he approached the end of his days, was the *perfect man* to write this soul-searching account!

Let's introduce *Ecclesiastes* 'lessons.

Read  $\underline{Ecc 1:1-11}$ ; now turn the pages w/ me to  $\underline{12:9-14}$ .

**How long** has it been since you've read through Solomon's *documentary* – this famous account of one man's *search for meaning*? Let me give you a little of its *background*...

- 1. We'll start w/ the book's title: *Ecclesiastes...?* Where did *that* come from? It comes from an ancient *Greek* translation of the *Hebrew* **OT**, and it means, *The Preacher*. (The Hebrew word is *Qoholet*.) That word, *preacher*, will appear *time* & *again* in Solomon's story.
- 2. *King Solomon* wrote *Ecclesiastes*. He probably penned its lessons late in his *life & rule*, so around **930** BC. → Almost **1000** years before Christ **3000** years ago. We surveyed Solomon as we introduced this morning's message.
- 3. Bible teachers put *Ecclesiastes* on the **OT** bookshelf labeled *Wisdom Literature*. Alongside books like *Job & Psalms & Proverbs & Song of Solomon*. (Solomon had a hand in several of *those books*, too!)
  - a. *Wisdom*... Ecclesiastes is about *wisdom*. In general, *wisdom* is the ability to *apply* what you *know*. Specifically, *wisdom* is the ability to see & live life from *God's* perspective to live *biblically*.
  - b. Do you remember what God says is the *absolute*, *ground-zero starting* point for wisdom? The **fear of the LORD** is the beginning of wisdom. (Pr 9:10 **Solomon**!)
  - c. That's *exactly* what Solomon discovered! No matter *where* you look, or *when*, or *how*, ... the fear of God is **still** the beginning of wisdom.
- 4. *Ecclesiastes* contains a lot of *key words & expressions* that Solomon uses over & over again. Looking for these words will help you *understand* what Solomon is trying to teach us.
  - a. Words like: vanity, vexation, toil, wind, work, fool, wicked, death.
  - b. **More** words, like: wise, good, time, know, eat, profit, portion, memory, just, & sun.

- c. Understanding some of Solomon's expressions *up front* is *absolutely essential*, or you'll completely *miss his point*:
  - i. Vanity (striving after the wind). There are three flavors of this word, & Solomon tastes them all! 1.) = fleeting (vapor) 2.) = meaningless (pointless); 3.) incomprehensible (unknowable) The last meaning incomprehensible is usually Solomon's point: God understands this; but I can't...
  - ii. Under the sun (under heaven) 2x. This expression is the key to unlocking Solomon's relentless quest for fulfillment. Those words (under the sun) are all over Ecclesiastes (read a few)!

    → 1:2-3, 1:9, 1:14, 2:11, 2:17, 3:1, 4:1, 5:18, 6:12 (many more).
    - 1. Some of that sounded kinda *gloomy*, didn't it? Why does so much of Ecclesiastes seem so *luke-warm*, or even *pessimistic?* Understanding *life under the sun* will help *unlock* Ecclesiastes for you!
    - 2. Here's how this works in the king's account:
    - 3. Solomon is drawing a *horizontal line* across the sky; his line passes right thru the sun. That line is traced across every page of *Ecclesiastes*. Everything *under* Solomon's line is completely *secular* & has little *concern or time* for God.
    - 4. Life is vain *under* the sun because life *under* the sun is life lived **w/o** the fear of the LORD. (2x) (brief pause)

- 5. These *key terms & phrases* are often the building-blocks of the story's *themes & big ideas*. What are the *big ideas* in Ecclesiastes (→ *five*)?
  - a. Vanity (3 flavors: futility, meaninglessness, incomprehensible). I don't understand everything I see, I just don't get it... Some of the things I do understand turn out to be disappointing & dissipating.
  - b. *Temporary consolation*. **Not** everything is bitter. *Some* things bring *some* happiness for *some* people for *some small span of time*. But it **won't** *last*... Often man's answer is to move on to the *next consolation*.
  - c. Life below the line (life under the sun). You chase your dreams w/o factoring in God, your dreams will never really bring fulfillment.
  - d. *The quest for fulfillment.* (→ *meaning*) What will make me *happy*? What will bring *lasting purpose* to my life? The *quest for fulfillment* is the *central theme* of Solomon's *soul-searching* documentary!
  - e. *Wisdom*. Life isn't *bad*. Despair *wouldn't* be Solomon's point! The *lesson* from Solomon's quest for fulfillment can be summed up as this: The *wise* (*godly*) *man* & *woman* fears God, and enjoys life as God's gift.
- 6. Those last **two** ideas of *quest* & *wisdom* define the *structure* (*outline*) of this timeless little book.
  - a. **Ch 1–6** document Solomon's *quest*. The *Preacher* begins with a *poem* (1:2-11), and continues w/the *parade* of all kinds of vain, *under the sun* pursuits.
  - b. Then, **ch 7-12** record Solomon's *conclusions*. All leading up to life's *biggest lesson*. Will you turn w/ me to **Ecc 12:9-14** (note esp 13-14).

Fear God & keep His commandments! The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom. Beloved, that is the priceless life-lesson Ecclesiastes has to offer.

When I read my Bible, I like to think about the author's "audience" – who was Solomon writing to, as he sat down to sum-up a lifetime of searching?

Read *Ecclesiastes* carefully, & I think you'll discover that Solomon was especially keen on communicating w/ young men & women (a lot like his *Book of Proverbs*).

11:9-10 – Rejoice, young man, during your childhood, and let your heart be pleasant during the days of your young manhood. And follow the impulses of your heart and the desires of your eyes. Yet know that God will bring you to judgment for all these things.

After all, Israel's king was grooming future kings & leaders.

Young people seem *especially* concerned w/thoughts of *meaning & fulfillment & the future*. But the young are also *idealistic & inexperienced*. They are *vulnerable*.

Young friends, *Ecclesiastes* was written as a warning to protect you. *Where* are the *answers* to your *questions? Who* knows the way to *joy* & *fulfillment* & *lifedefining purpose?* 

Solomon made the *journey* & Solomon came back, bruised & battered, but w/ the answer!

You come back, young friends, we'll explore his path, together!
