Week Six: Psalm 110: Jesus, Yahweh's Royal Son Rules The Nations Doug Hayes: January 7, 2024

Review: My goals in this class are to:

- Explore the biblical and theological rationale for why David wrote this Psalm, with its Messianic expectations. This will require us to go from Genesis all the way through the OT Scriptures to Psalm 110.
- Understand and appreciate Psalm 110 itself, and how it anticipates the coming of the Christ.
- Briefly look at all of the NT passages that quote and allude to Psalm 110 to comprehend and appreciate the importance of it to Jesus and the Apostles.
- Allow Psalm 110 inform our understanding of the person of Christ in relation to us and the world, and to better appreciate what Christ has done for us, and the hope that we have in Jesus.

Davidic Authorship - Mt. 22:41-46 "David in the Spirit" [prophet]; Mk. 12:35-37 "David himself said by the Spirit" [prophet]; Lk. 20:41-44; Acts 2:30-35 "David...being a prophet")

Matthew 22:41–46 (NKJV)

⁴¹ While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, ⁴² saying, "What do you think about <u>the Christ</u>? Whose Son is He?" They said to Him, "*The Son* of David." ⁴³ He said to them, "How then does <u>David in the Spirit call Him 'Lord</u>,' saying: ⁴⁴ '<u>The LORD</u> <u>said to my Lord</u>, "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool"</u> '? ⁴⁵ If David then calls Him 'Lord,' how is He his Son?" ⁴⁶ And no one was able to answer Him a word, nor from that day on did anyone dare question Him anymore.

Mark 12:35-37 (NKJV)

³⁵ Then Jesus answered and said, while He taught in the temple, "How *is it* that the scribes say that the Christ is the Son of David? ³⁶ For David himself said by the Holy Spirit: 'The LORD said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, Till I make Your enemies Your footstool." '³⁷ Therefore David himself calls Him 'Lord'; how is He then his Son?" And the common people heard Him gladly.

Luke 20:41–44 (NKJV)

⁴¹ And He said to them, "How can they say that the Christ is the Son of David? ⁴² Now David himself said in the Book of Psalms: 'The LORD said to my Lord, "Sit at My right hand, ⁴³ Till I make Your enemies Your footstool." '44 Therefore David calls Him 'Lord'; how is He then his Son?"

Acts 2:29–36 (NKJV)

²⁹ "Men *and* brethren, let *me* speak freely to you of the patriarch <u>David</u>, that he is both dead and buried, and his tomb is with us to this day. ³⁰ Therefore, <u>being a prophet</u>, and <u>knowing that God had sworn with an oath</u> to him that of the fruit of his body, according to the flesh, <u>He would raise up the Christ to sit on his throne</u>, ³¹ he, <u>foreseeing this</u>, spoke concerning the resurrection of the Christ, that His soul was not left in Hades, nor did His flesh see corruption. ³² This Jesus God has raised up, of which we are all witnesses. ³³ Therefore being exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He poured out this which you now see and hear. ³⁴ "For <u>David did not ascend into the heavens</u>, but he says himself: '*The LORD said to my Lord*, "Sit at <u>My right hand</u>, ³⁵ Till I make Your enemies Your footstool." ³⁶ "Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ."

Yahweh & Adonai = Lord/master

Yahweh is the proper covenant name of God. Adonai is not a name, but a title used of human masters or even husbands (Gen. 18:12; 19:2; 40:1; Ruth 2:13), as well as a title for Yahweh, as in Ex. 34:23 ("the lord Yahweh, God of Israel").
