Intro: Jesus continues the Olivet Discourse in Matthew 25, teaching 3 parables that warn us to watch while we wait with expectant hope for His second coming.

- I. The Three Parables Matthew 25
 - A. Girls and Their Lamps
 - B. Talents
 - C. Sheep and Goats
 - D. Points in Common
 - 1. In each case, the return of the Lord is sudden and unexpected.
 - a. False signs: false christs, wars, famine, persecution, apostacy, false prophets/teachers
 - b. When He actually comes, it will be so sudden and unexpected that no sign can be given
 - 2. In each case the Lord's return results in an unalterable division between two groups of people.
 - a. Judgment means "division"
 - b. Gk: krisis an event that requires turning one way or the other
 - 3. In each case the people who are lost are utterly surprised at their rejection by Christ.
 - a. These all think they are saved.
 - b. These are all part of the visible church.
- II. Sensible and Silly Girls vs. 1-13
 - A. The Wedding Banquet
 - 1. Bride and Bridegroom
 - 2. Attendants
 - 3. Friends and Family
 - B. Ten Unmarried Girls
 - 1. Some were foolish and silly unprepared no oil for their torches
 - 2. Some were prudent, wide, and sensible prepared extra oil on hand
 - 3. All were invited to the wedding and had accepted Matt. 13:20-22
 - 4. All called the Bridegroom "Lord" (see vs. 11, 37, 44)
 - 5. All fell asleep while waiting Matt. 26:40-41, 45-46
 - C. The Bridegroom is Coming! Meet Him!
 - 1. Those with oil were ready but those without oil had torches that were going out
 - 2. While they were gone to get more oil the feast started and doors were shut
 - 3. "I do not know you." Matt. 7:21-23
- III. Application
 - A. Be Awake = Be Ready
 - B. The Lord will Come without Warning
 - 1. Being prepared is not transferable, others cannot be ready for you
 - 2. Last minute preparations will be too late
 - 3. Keeping awake is more about being ready than disrupting normal routines of life
 - 4. When ready, one can sleep secure in the knowledge that they are prepared
 - 5. How can we expect the unexpected? John 3:3

Matthew 13:20-22

20 And the one on whom seed was sown on the rocky places, this is the man who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; 21 yet he has no root in himself, but is only temporary, and when affliction or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he falls away. 22 And the one on whom seed was sown among the thorns, this is the one who hears the word, and the worry of the world and the deceitfulness of wealth choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful.
