JESUS SERMON ABOUT HIMSELF (2)

I. I am filled with the Spirit II. I am come to preach the Gospel

III. I am come to be the Gospel

I. I AM FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT: a sweet and encouraging tiding!

II. I AM COME TO PREACH THE GOSPEL

- A. Jesus' preaching is purest Gospel preaching
 - 1. What is the Gospel?
 - a. The Divine message about what God is doing to save sinners
 - 2. Jesus Gospel addresses five needs we face as sinners
 - a. He preaches the Gospel to the *poor*
 - b. He heals the brokenhearted
 - c. He proclaims liberty to the captives
 - d. He preaches recovery of the sight of the blind
 - e. He sets at liberty that are *bruised* (*G*: *oppressed*)
 - 3. Facing this gloomy truth, Jesus preached the *Year of Jubilee* (Lev. 25:9-15)

III. I AM COME TO BE THE GOSPEL

- A. The Gospel is essence is Jesus Himself
 - 1. Words and wishes do not save any from the gloom and doom of sin!
 - 2. Only the deeds and death of Jesus will do that!

- B. The Gospel is therefore Jesus' Person and Work in two parts
 - 1. The 1st part: the story of His love for us!
 - 2. The 2nd part: the story of His love in us!

Gather yourself together ... (Zeph. 2:1)

- A. Jesus has announced Himself to be among us as the Savior for you
 - 1. Luke 19:10: For the Son of man is come to seek & save that which is lost.
 - 2. Luke 5:32: I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance!
- B. Will you bear witness and wonder about these gracious Words as they did?
- C. What must I do then as I cannot save, change, or even humble myself?
 - 1. Obey the call of God!
 - 2. Cast yourself upon the Jesus of God!

By obeying Christ's commands, you will gain more than you can give. (T. Brooks)
