Notes for Further Study

- 1. Verse 29 in Mark 8 is a turning point in the Gospel. For the first time, it is plainly stated that Jesus is the Christ. Look at verse 31. He **began** to teach them...
 - a. Read Isaiah 52:13-53:12. What was content of the teaching Jesus began with His disciples?
 - b. Read Mark 9:30-32 and 10:32-34. How important is this teaching? Did the disciples understand it?
 - c. Why did Peter initially reject this? Read Matthew 4:1-11. Why this terrible rebuke by Jesus?
 - d. Do we ever deserve such a rebuke? Are there times we think about "man's things" and not "God's things?"
- 2. What is significant about "calling the crowd to Him" in v. 34? Is the risk associated with faith just for "full-time workers?"
 - a. To "deny" is also to "renounce." In what ways have you had to do this in your own life?
 - b. Read Luke's account above. He adds what time-related word in verse 23? How does this change the level of commitment that Jesus is talking about?
 - c. Read Psalm 49:7-9. Discuss ways in which we try to "ransom" or "purchase" our lives. This is impossible.
 - d. In what ways have you been ashamed of Christ? In what ways have you tried to "gain the world?"
- 3. Read Mark 8:38-9:1. Do these verses describe one event?
 - a. Verse 38 describes the final judgment of Christ. He will separate the sheep and the goats. Who will stand?
 - b. Verse 1 is not the final judgment. How can we tell? What is the event? (New birth? Resurrection? Pentecost? Transfiguration?) Read Matthew 4:17; 27:51-54; Acts 1:8.
 - c. How is Jesus describing "life and death" in these verses?
