Exhort slaves to subordinate themselves to their own masters in all respects, to be well-pleasing, not contradicting, <sup>1</sup> not embezzling, but instead exhibiting all good faith...

- (1) Respect
  - (a) "Subordinating themselves to their own masters in all respects"
  - (b) "To be well-pleasing"
  - (c) "Not contradicting"
- (2) Rectitude ("not embezzling")
- (3) Reliability ("but instead exhibiting all good faith")
