Theological Series—Our Triune God of Love

<u>10:30 am Worship Service:</u> Colossians 1:15-20; Psalm 27:1-14; 104:1-35

God's Overflowing Delight and Beauty

The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have made a beautiful Creation for us to enjoy with them.

1. All of Creation Testifies to God's Beauty (Colossians 1).

2. Our Triune God Is Captivatingly Beautiful (Psalm 27).

3. God Has Freed Us to Delight in His Splendor (Psalm 104).

Conclusion: God is perfectly beautiful. All three persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are eternally united yet diverse. The Creation that they together have brought into existence proclaims this glorious splendor and calls all who perceive it to give praise to the Lord. They have accomplished our redemption to free us to enjoy the New Heaven and New Earth together with them and one another forever. Let us delight together in our great God and enjoy His Creation to His glory!

Psalm 27:4

One thing have I asked of the LORD, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to gaze upon *the beauty of the LORD* and to inquire in his temple.

Romans 8:19-25

For the **creation** waits with eager longing for the *revealing of the sons of God.*²⁰ For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of him who subjected it, in hope ²¹ that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to corruption and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. ²² For we know that the whole creation has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. ²³ And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴ For in this hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what he sees? ²⁵ But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

Genesis 1:1-5

In the beginning, *God* created the heavens and the earth.² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the *Spirit of God* was hovering over the *face of the waters*.

³ And *God said*, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴ And God saw that the light was good. And God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵ God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

Mark 1:9-11

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And when he came up out of the water, immediately he saw the heavens being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

Taking Gathered Worship Home

Throughout the Bible God reveals Himself as the Creator of all that there is and the Redeemer of His people. Both of these accomplishments (creation and redemption) demonstrate God's incomparable beauty. The fullness of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is at work in both and enable us to join in God's eternal love.

Please use the devotional material below each day this week to praise Christ. Ask Jesus to teach us His ways that we may walk in them to accomplish His purposes.

Sunday Morning

READ Colossians 1:15-20; Psalm 27:1-14; 36:5-9; 104:1-35; Romans 8:19-25; Genesis 1:1-4; Mark 1:9-11. DISCUSS What is the most beautiful aspect of God to you? Why? How do you see His beauty reflected in Creation? How are you praising Him for it? SERVE someone in need. MEDITATE on Psalm 27:4. PRAY "Triune God, You are all beautiful. Make us more and more desirous of You."

Sunday Evening

GATHER for Young Adult Bible Study and Fellowship at 6pm.

Monday

READ **Colossians 1:15-20**; **Psalm 27:1-14**. DISCUSS What does it mean for Jesus to be the "firstborn of all creation?" What difference does it make that all that was made was by Him, through Him, and for Him? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE **Psalm 27:4**. PRAY, "Father God, You have testified to Your love of Your Son with the magnificence of the galaxies. Teach us to treat Creation as the tribute You intended."

Tuesday

READ **Colossians 1:15-20; Psalm 36:5-9**. DISCUSS How do the heavens reflect His faithfulness? What about the deep speaks about God's beauty? Why has God blessed sinners with the blessings of Creation? SERVE by considering someone else's needs *above your own*! MEDITATE on **Psalm 27:4**. PRAY, "Lord Jesus, we see *Your faithfulness all around and most clearly on the cross*. Enable us to honor You in the way we steward Creation and delight in what You have made."

Wednesday

READ Colossians 1:15-20; Psalm 104:1-35; Romans 8:19-25. DISCUSS God speaks about Creation as clothing that adorns His beauty. How does this image help you? SERVE by *caring about someone else* more than yourself! MEDITATE on Psalm 27:4. PRAY, "Holy Spirit, thank You for renewing the ground and bringing life in so many amazing ways! Enable us to praise You."

Thursday

READ Romans 8:19-25; Genesis 1:1-4; Mark 1:9-11. DISCUSS What similarities do you see between Creation and Christ's baptism? Do you see all three members of the Trinity? SERVE by putting someone else's interests *above your own*! MEDITATE on Psalm 27:4. PRAY, "Triune God, thank You for the generous way You love us and surround us with Your beauty."

Friday

READ Colossians 1:15-20; Psalm 27:1-14; 36:5-9; 104:1-35; Romans 8:19-25; Genesis 1:1-4; Mark 1:9-11. DISCUSS, What has the Holy Spirit been teaching you this week through these passages? MEDITATE on Psalm 27:4. PRAY that we at FCCW would *be transformed together by God's self-giving love and beauty*.

Saturday

PREPARE for gathered worship tomorrow. READ Mark 1:1-45. Invite others to join you tomorrow for the worship service @ 10:30. Ask Jesus to reveal Himself to us in His Word by His Spirit.
