- 3. Read **John 5:39-46**. How can you testify to the ways selfish motives or sinful desires cloud the clear understanding and application of Scripture?
- 4. Read **Ephesians 1:16-23**. What is the practical advantage for Christians to pray (for themselves and others) and see God answer the prayers found in vv.17-19?
- 5. Read Hebrews 9:11-15. How do you think your daily life would be impacted if you were to understand more of the depths and riches of this description of Christ's work?
