"An Extravagant Love" John 12:1-8

Faith and Love to Christ seen in Mary's Example

1. Faith and Love Exhibited

vv. 1-3

- (1) The Setting
 - Bethany, very close to Jerusalem (cf. Matt. 26: at the home of Simon the leper)
 - Mary, Martha, Lazarus, and the twelve all present
 - Our Lord's death fast approaching
- (2) An Act of Love and Devotion "Then Mary took a pound of very costly oil of spikenard, anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped His feet with her hair.
 - -1- Extravagant!

And the whole house was filled with the fragrance of the oil."

- A perfumed oil from the spikenard plant apparently imported from the Himalayas
- Its value = a year's wages!
- The whole of the contents poured upon our Lord's head and feet
- The whole house filled with the fragrance!

-2- Oblivious to the Opinions of Men!

- A woman!
- She wipes the Lord's feet with her hair humility
- A single focus here.

2. Faith and Love Opposed

vv. 4-6

"Why was this fragrant oil not sold for three hundred denarii

- (1) The complaint voiced by Judas:
- and given to the poor?"

- -"Why this waste!?"
- Should have been sold and used for benevolence

(2) The heart – open and laid bare!

"This he said, not that he cared for the poor, but because he was a thief, and had the money box; and he used to take what was put in it."

3. Faith and Love Commended

vv. 7-8

(1) Our Lord defends His worshiper!

"Let her alone"

(2) He commends her faith

"she has kept this for the day of My burial."

- Mary had believed our Lord when He spoke of His death!
- This act of faith and devotion would be known throughout the world! cf. Matt. 26

(3) He commends this as a matter of spiritual priority

"For the poor you have with you always, but Me you do not have always."

- -1- Priority of worship of devotion to Christ.
- There would be many more opportunities to attend to the needs of the poor.
- Very little opportunity left to show love and devotion to Christ in His state of humiliation.
- -2- Serving the needs of others flows out of true worship and devotion to Christ
